- 6. Become a good listener.








1. Speaking is needed to connect with others in community.





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












Proverbs 15:1

Our words also affect the anger in those around us.

The three "G"s of wise speech Genuine - Gracious - Gentle.

James 3:2

"For we all stumble in many ways. And if anyone does not stumble in what he says, he is a perfect man, able also to bridle his whole body."

3. The use of our tongue is perhaps the hardest ethical challenge we face.



James 1:26

"If anyone thinks he is religious and does not bridle his tongue but deceives his heart, this person's religion is worthless."

> Our words are a sign of our spiritual maturity or lack thereof.

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Signs of Spiritual Maturity

- · How we use our tongue
- How we use money
- How we respond to personal success and failure
- How we respond to personal suffering
- How we respond to the great and least among us

Matthew 12:34

4. Managing the tongue starts with giving attention to the heart.

When our heart is right, we will "generally" say the right thing.

When our heart is influenced by fear or anger we are likely to say the wrong thing.

Our words can render us defiled before God and destructive before man.

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Proverbs 21:23

"He who guards his mouth and his tongue, guards his soul from troubles."

Our words can not only expose a bad heart, they can also exacerbate it.

"When digging yourself in a hole, the first step is to STOP DIGGING."

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Ephesians 4:29

"Let no corrupting talk come out of your mouths, but only such as is good for building up, as fits the occasion, that it may give grace to those who hear."

5. Managing the tongue demands sensitivity to context.


Give attention to timing, occasion, need, & grace.
