Being a Christian doesn't change what you deal with, so much as how you deal with it.


perhaps the most Fear powerful negative emotion affecting spiritual decisions.

Genesis 3 suggests that

John 3 reveals that

The fear of God is the root of all human anxiety.

Jesus came to take away our deepest fear.



John 3

"16 For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish, but have eternal life. 17 For God did not send the Son into the world to judge the world, but that the world should be saved through Him. 18 He who believes in Him is not judged; he who does not believe has been judged already, because he has not believed in the name of the only begotten Son of God. 19 And this is the judgment, that the light is come into the world, and men loved the darkness rather than the light; for their deeds were evil. 20 For everyone who does evil hates the light, and does not come to the light, lest his deeds should be exposed. 21 But he who practices the truth comes to the light, that his deeds may be manifested as having been wrought in God."

1 John 1

"5 This is the message we have heard from him and announce to you, that God is light, and in Him there is no darkness at all. 6 If we say that we have fellowship with Him and yet walk in the darkness, we lie and do not practice the truth; 7 but if we walk in the light as He Himself is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus His Son cleanses us from all sin. 8 If we say that we have no sin, we are deceiving ourselves and the truth is not in us. 9 If we confess our sins, he is faithful and righteous to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness."

"Practice the truth" does not mean that we have no sin but rather that we see more than our sin as we face the light (Jesus).

Both Peter & Judas betrayed Jesus and suffered remorse as they saw what their sin did to Jesus.

Peter would abide long enough to see what Jesus did to his sin. Judas took his own life and never saw what Jesus did to his sin.

If we don't let our sins draw us to Jesus, we are left alone in them.

Paraphrase

"16 God's love is behind my mission to save all who believe in me. 17 Do not be afraid, I was not sent to condemn but to save. 18 Those who believe in me escape judgment, while those who run away from me have only themselves to blame for their fate. 19 They are intimidated by their sin 20 and sadly feel more at home with the darkness. 21 But those who walk in the truth brave the light, and let their sin draw them to me so as to be saved thus revealing God's plan."

We are separated from God not only by our sins but more so by our refusing to accept God's salvation in the Cross of Christ.

The great exchange

2 Corinthians 5:21

"He made Him who knew no sin to be sin on our behalf, so that we might become the righteousness of God in Him."



Romans 8

"1 There is therefore now **no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus**. 2 For the law of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus has set you free from the law of sin and of death. 3 For what the Law could not do, weak as it was through the flesh, God did: sending His own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh and as an offering for sin, He condemned sin in the flesh,"

John 5:24

"Truly. truly. I say to you. he who hears my word, and believes Him who sent me, has eternal life, and **does not come into judgment**, but has passed out of death into life."

Luke 19

"7 And when they (Religious leaders) saw it (Jesus dining with a tax collector), they all began to grumble, saying, "He has gone to be the guest of a man who is a sinner." . . . 9 And Jesus said to him, "Today salvation has come to this house, because he, too, is a son of Abraham. 10 For the Son of Man has come to seek and to save that which was lost."

The point of Jesus as the light


The Light of Jesus is not only to reveal our darkness but to show us the heart of God and the gracious way of salvation.

Remember

- 1. Jesus came to save not to condemn.
- 2. Jesus is not intimidating but rather a friend of sinners.
- 3. The TRUTH and FAITH will set us free from FEAR.
- 4. The issue NOW is not our sin but Jesus.
