


Luke 15:25-32

Galatians 1:6-9

“I am amazed that you are so quickly deserting Him who called you by the grace of Christ, for a different gospel; which is {really} no other; only there are some who are disturbing you, and want to distort the gospel of Christ. But even though we, or an angel from heaven, should preach to you a gospel contrary to that which we have preached to you, **let him be accursed**. As we have said before, so I say again now, if any man is preaching to you a gospel contrary to that which you received, **let him be accursed**.”

“²⁵ Now his **older son** was in the field, and when he came and approached the house, he heard music and dancing. ²⁶ And he summoned one of the servants and began inquiring what these things might be. ²⁷ And he said to him, “Your brother has come, and your father has killed the fattened calf, because he has received him back safe and sound.” ²⁸ But he became angry, and was not willing to go in; and his father came out and began entreating him.”

“²⁹ But he answered and said to his father, “Look! For so many years I have been serving you, and I have never neglected a command of yours; and yet you have never given me a kid, that I might be merry with my friends; ³⁰ but when this son of yours came, who has devoured your wealth with harlots, you killed the fattened calf for him.” ³¹ And he said to him, “My child, you have always been with me, and all that is mine is yours. ³² But we had to be merry and rejoice, for this brother of yours was dead and has begun to live, and was lost and has been found.”

a score-keeping spirit.

The Pharisee and the Tax collector Luke 18:10-14

Test yourself

- ✓ Is obedience an investment for which you expect a payback from God?
- ✓ Do you feel secure because you have a “better record” than those around you?
- ✓ Do you feel bitter when you don’t get recognition for your sacrificial service?

The religious spirit is

a superficial spirit.

“²⁹ But he answered and said to his father, “Look! For so many years I have been serving you, and **I have never neglected a command of yours**; and yet you have never given me a kid, that I might be merry with my friends;”

“you are like whitewashed tombs”
Matthew 23:27

Test yourself

- ✓ Do you find it easier to confess the sins of others than your own sins?
- ✓ Do you find security in looking good on the outside?
- ✓ Are you selective in what you count as a serious sin in your own life?

The religious spirit is

a separatist spirit.

“²⁸ But he became angry, and **was not willing to go in**”

“Why is your Teacher eating with the tax-gatherers and sinners?”
Matthew 9:11

Test yourself

- ✓ Do you withhold love as a means of correcting others?
- ✓ Do you have a hard time forgiving those who embarrass or hurt you?
- ✓ Do you apply grace to others in the same way you do to yourself?

The religious spirit is

a sour spirit.

“³⁰ but when **this son of yours** came, who has devoured your wealth with harlots, you killed the fattened calf for him.” . . . “³² But we had to be merry and rejoice, for **this brother of yours** was dead and has begun to live, and was lost and has been found.”

“Behold, a friend of tax-gatherers and sinners!” Matthew 11:19

Test yourself

- ✓ **Are you disappointed when those who have sinned against you are forgiven without suffering consequences?**
- ✓ **Do you have a hard time with Biblical examples of radical grace?**
- ✓ **Do you have a hard time being a blessing to those who have hurt you?**

The point of this text

The blessings of God's Kingdom are for those who experience and express God's grace.

Lessons from this text

- ✓ **We must identify the religious spirit and deal with it harshly in our own lives.**
- ✓ **We need to resist the proud and give grace to the humble in our churches.**
- ✓ **We are to guard high ethical standards and not over react to legalism.**
