


Acts 17

1. Berean Christians are seeker skeptics with receptive hearts and rational minds.


Humans seem incurably RELIGIOUS, grounding their lives on faith based presuppositions.


- This includes but extends beyond formal institutional religions (Christianity, Judaism, Islam, etc.) to embrace metaphysical materialism, secular humanism, etc.
- Presuppositions are by nature faith based and when not affiliated with formal religion are often subconscious.

Humans are also incredibly RATIONAL,

building on their presuppositions a set of assertions and behaviors that are justified as logical extensions of their beliefs.

 These assertions and behaviors though rational are often defended without acknowledging the faith (religious) presuppositions on which they are based.


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Matthew 6

"22 **The lamp of the body is the eye**; if therefore your eye is clear, your whole body will be full of light. . . . 24 **No one can serve two masters**; for either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will hold to one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and mammon."

Our reasoning will be influenced by our presuppositions (foundational worldview).

All we need to know for peace in life is revealed in what God HAS revealed.

You might be a Berean if:

- √ you have a longing for peace with God, self, and others
- √ you demand a rationale for your faith
- √ you distinguish between major and minor issues.
- √ you do not believe everything you hear
- √ you recognize that Scripture is written FOR you but not always TO you or ABOUT you
- √ you respect context, (historical, literary, cultural, and circumstantial)

Some general rules in dealing with theological difficulties.

- √ There are many more wrong answers than right answers.
- √ We will always fail to see some things clearly in this life.
- √ It is wiser to live with a paradox than to remove it with an erroneous dogma.
- √ Certainty is based on evidence, logic, culture, and commitment (faith).
- √ Respect for 1) the complexity of an issue and 2) those who honestly differ, are gracious virtues.

- **✓ Blindly following tradition and culture.**
- ✓ Demonizing all who disagree with us.
- ✓ Dogmatically defending our opinions on all points.
- ✓ Dramatizing every issue as a "major."
- **✓ Demanding that everything be Black & White.**
- √ Expecting that God will give us special revelation knowledge through prayer.
- √ Refusing to be open to change by personalizing all convictions.
