

We are also told that all those who have not heard the Gospel and placed faith in Jesus are going to hell.

Is that just?

Human choice (pluralism)

All Evangelical Christians agree that:

1. Jesus Christ is the ONLY WAY of salvation.

John 14:6 "Jesus said to him, I am the way, and the truth, and the life; no one comes to the Father, but through Me."

2. Christ's **DEATH & RESURRECTION** is the basis of human redemption.

2 Corinthians 5:21 "He made Him who knew no sin to be sin on our behalf, that we might become the righteousness of God in Him."

3. We are reconciled to God through FAITH IN JESUS CHRIST.

John 3:17-18

"He who believes in Him is not judged; he who does not believe has been judged already, because he has not believed in the name of the only begotten Son of God."

Romans 10:9-10

"that if you **confess with your mouth** Jesus as Lord, and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you shall be saved; for with the heart man believes, resulting in righteousness, and **with the mouth he confesses, resulting in salvation.**"

The message of the book of Romans makes this clear.

- 1. All people have enough "light" to be responsible before God. (1:18-20)
- 2. It is by faith in Christ that sins are forgiven. (3:21-26)
- 3. Faith comes by hearing the gospel preached. (10:8-21)
- 4. People can have a zeal for God but still be unsaved. (10:2-4)

All Evangelicals DO NOT agree

All Evangelicals DO NOT agree

as to how saving faith is recognized or how God's grace is ultimately received.

Luke 23

"33 And when they came to the place called The Skull, there they crucified Him and the criminals, one on the right and the other on the left. 34 But Jesus was saying, "Father, forgive them; for they do not know what they are doing." And they cast lots, dividing up His garments among themselves."

Reconciliation was completed by Christ's sacrifice without man's faith.

2 Corinthians 5:18-19

"All this is from God, who **reconciled** us to himself through Christ and gave us the ministry of reconciliation, that God **was reconciling** the world to himself in Christ, not counting men's sins against them."

Christ's sacrifice is the basis of salvation.

But could it be available to some who have not known him or expressed faith in him?

Biblical examples

- Holy Pagans Job, Abimelech (king of Gerar -Gen.20:1-18), Jethro (a priest of Midian - Ex.18:1-12),
- Jews who lived before Jesus was born Abraham.
- The people of Nineveh (Jonah).
- Abel, Enoch, Noah, being neither Jews nor Christians, pleased God because they sought Him with the faith response which pleases Him (Heb.11:6)
- Melchizedek (a mysterious Canaanite priest) Gen.14:17-24. Heb.6:20-7:22.
 - The Magi (wise men) Matt.2:1-12
 - Matthew 10:15; 11:22; 12:41-42 the Ninevites, the queen of Sheba, the inhabitants of Tyre and Sidon, Sodom and Gomorrah.

Could God's grace be broader than what we have thought?

- 1. The revelation that we have clearly indicates that outside of confession of faith in Christ as savior there IS NO REASON FOR ASSURANCE OF HOPE.
- 2. This is the MESSAGE we must proclaim.
- 3. The extension of God's grace beyond what we preach, if possible, IS NOT REVEALED TO US.

NOTE:



1. We know that the inclusion of Gentiles in God's grace was a mystery **UNKNOWN** to Israel before Pentecost.

> 2. We see subtle CLUES of "extended mercy" in Scripture.

Telling the Gospel story

- 1. God (not you or I) makes the rules, keeps the score, and judges the soul.
- 2. I trust that God will be fair.
- 3. The standard Be true to myself as a human, created to reflect God's image in this world.
- 4. In the Cross of Christ, God has made provision for insecure sinners, who feel they fall short.
- 5. Those who place their faith in Christ are assured of eternal life.
- 6. No one is forced to trust Christ.
- 7. We are free to stand before God on the basis of our own merits knowing that He will be fair.

But when the light of God's broad plan The mystery hid in ages past Is brought to light at Calvary A new perspective then is cast.


