

The bottom two are what most think of as **SUFFERING** that is inconsistent with a powerful, caring God.

Suffering invites us to renew our perspective of **human nature, God's self revelation, and the Gospel.**

All **religions & philosophies** seek to explain, manage, and eliminate suffering.

Romans 1

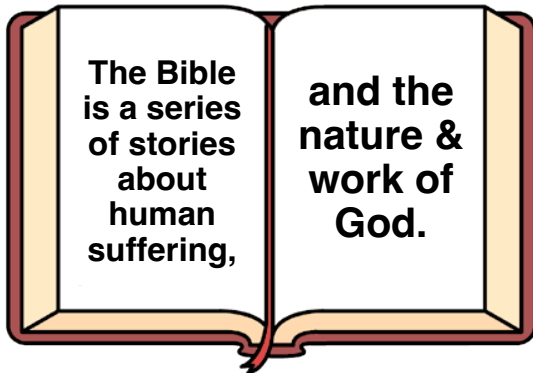

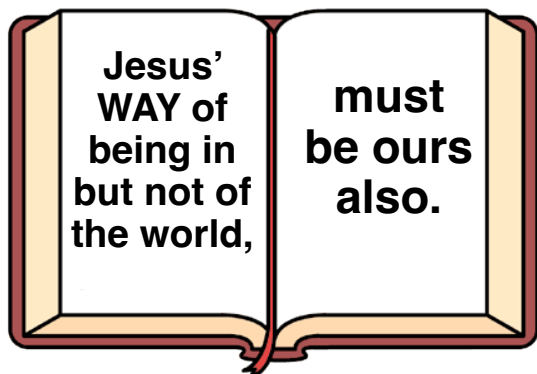
To remove suffering is to stunt our spiritual formation and forget how Jesus learned obedience.

Our suffering does not contribute to the atonement for our sin but it does draw us nearer to an intimate relationship with the one who died.

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**Suffering strengthened Paul’s
“love of” and “faith in” God.**

“¹⁸ For I consider that the **sufferings of this present time** are not worthy to be compared with the glory that is to be revealed to us. . . . ³⁵ Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall **tribulation**, or **distress**, or **persecution**, or **famine**, or **nakedness**, or **peril**, or **sword**? ³⁶ Just as it is written, “*For Thy sake we are being put to death all day long; We were considered as sheep to be slaughtered.*” . . . ³⁸ For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, ³⁹ nor height, nor depth, nor any other created thing, shall be able to separate us from the love of God, which is in Christ Jesus our Lord.”

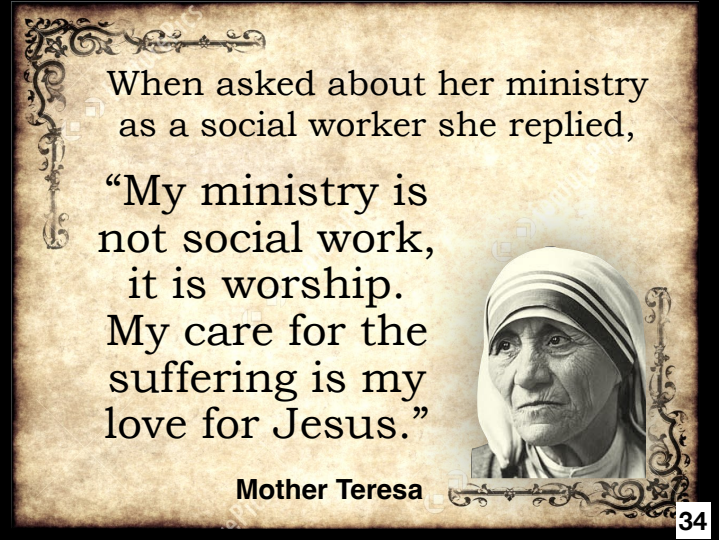

others who suffer.**

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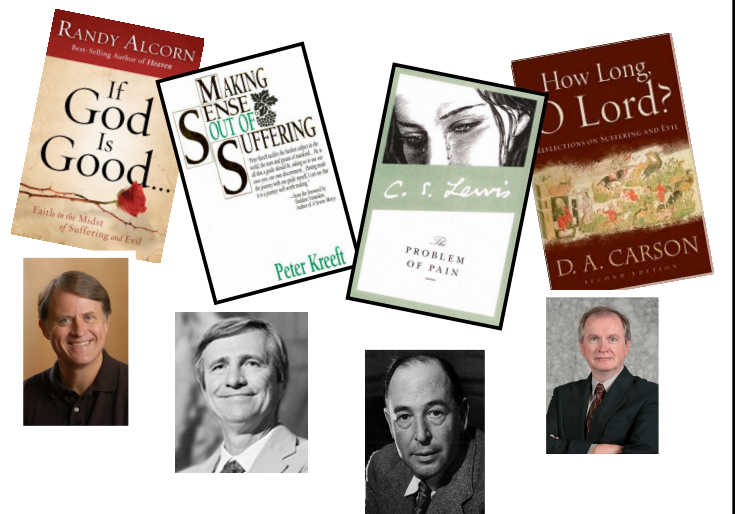


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How to respond to suffering

1. Expect to suffer in this life (Rom.8:18-25).
2. Fix your eyes on Jesus (Heb.12:1-2).
3. Remember that God is with you (Ps.23:4).
4. Gain insight from suffering (Heb.5:8).
5. Don't ask “Why?” but rather “How” am I to respond now?
6. Live and walk by faith, in the Spirit (Gal.5:25).
7. Live in hope, knowing it all will be worth it (Rom.8:18).

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
