
# T - U - L - I - P

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# TULIP's roots (presuppositions)

• Inerrancy of Scripture demands that we take the texts literally, at face value.

- God's sovereignty demands the micromanagement of all things.
- Human free choice is viewed as a meritorious act.
- All of Scripture must be understood so as to conform to the above convictions.



# **Pruning TULIP** (Arminian theology)

- **T** otal depravity Affects every area of life but the "image of God" remains alive.
- U nconditional election God elected Christ and all that He foresaw would respond to him in faith.
- L imited atonement Christ's death paid the debt of all humanity but its benefits were realized only by those who received Christ by faith.
- rresistible grace We are free to receive or reject Christ.
- Perseverance of the saints Salvation is secure for those who maintain their faith and hope in Christ.

### 1 Peter 1

"1 Peter, an apostle of Jesus Christ, to those who reside as aliens, scattered throughout Pontus, Galatia, Cappadocia, Asia, and Bithynia, who are chosen **(elect)** 2 according to the foreknowledge **(prognosis)** of God the Father, by the sanctifying work of the Spirit, to obey Jesus Christ and be sprinkled with his blood:" 14

# What should be the governing lens of God's glory, grace, and governance?

- Jesus Christ is the perfect image of God?
- Jesus' life models a dynamic relationship rather than a micromanaged world.
- "Foreknowledge" captures the heart of the lens through which we must read the texts.
- The implications of Calvinism (ie. A good God decreeing evil) is hard to escape and even harder to accept.
- The texts used to support the Calvinistic view deserve a careful look.

# Jn.6, Eph.1, Rom.9

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Calvinist proof text #1

# John (O.T. believers)

6:37 "All that the Father gives Me shall come to Me, and the one who comes to Me I will certainly not cast out."

*10:27* "My sheep hear My voice, and I know them, and they follow Me;"

- These texts refer to the believing "remnant" in Israel who were already justified by faith (like Abraham).
- They heard Jesus, recognized him as the promised Messiah, and followed him.

Calvinist proof text #2


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# Ephesians 1 (Jesus is the elect)

"4 just as He **chose** us **in Him** before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and blameless before Him in love. 5 He **predestined** us to adoption as sons **through Jesus Christ** to Himself, according to the kind intention of His will, 6 to the praise of the glory of His grace, which He freely bestowed on us **in the Beloved**."

# 1 Peter 2:4 (Isa.42:1, Lk.9:35)

Jesus is "a living stone,...rejected by men, but **choice (elect)**...in the sight of God."



Calvinist proof text #3

## Romans 9

"6 But it is not as though the word of God has failed. For they are not all Israel who are descended from Israel; 7 neither are they all children because they are Abraham's descendants, but: "through Isaac your descendants will be named." 8 That is, it is not the children of the flesh who are children of God, but the children of the promise are regarded as descendants. 9 For this is a word of promise: "At this time I will come, and Sarah shall have a son." 10 And not only this, but there was Rebekah also, when she had conceived twins by one man, our father Isaac; 11 for though the twins were not yet born, and had not done anything good or bad, in order that God's purpose according to His choice might stand, not because of works, but because of Him who calls, 12 it was said to her, "The older will serve the younger." 13 Just as it is written, "Jacob I loved, but Esau I hated." 19

#### Calvinist proof text #3

### Jacob is Israel, Esau is Edom (gentiles)

#### Malachi 1

"2 I have loved you," says the Lord. But you say, "How have You loved us?" "Was Esau not Jacob's brother?" declares the Lord. "Yet I have loved Jacob; 3 but I have hated Esau, and I have made his mountains a desolation and given his inheritance to the jackals of the wilderness." 4 Though Edom says, "We have been beaten down, ... (and the Lord says) 5 your eyes will see *this*, and you will say, "The Lord be exalted beyond the border of Israel!""



#### Calvinist proof text #3

#### Romans 9 (Corporate election)

"16 So then it does not depend on the man who wills or the man who runs, but on God who has mercy.... 30 What shall we say then? That Gentiles, who did not pursue righteousness, attained righteousness, even the righteousness which is by faith; 31 but **Israel**, pursuing a law of righteousness, did not arrive at that law. 32 Why? Because they did not pursue it by faith, but as though it were by works. They stumbled over the stumbling stone, 33 just as it is written, "Behold, I lay in Zion a stone of stumbling and a rock of offense, And he who believes in Him will not be disappointed."" 21

# What is the take home of this lesson? Be a Berean

Calvinists point to the rigid decrees of God, while Arminians point to the relational dynamics of God.

Both are right in what they affirm but wrong in what they deny.

The Bible gives us a theology which is more human than Calvinism, and more divine than Arminianism. and more Christian than either of them.
