


## In what sense is separation of church and state biblical?

"There is a way which **seems right** to a man, but its end is the **way of death**."


#### Isaiah 55:8



Some believe that the Mayflower Compact should be the basis for a Christian nation founded upon a covenant relationship with God. They did not prevail.








## What does the Scripture tell us about church and state relationships?

### Acts 17:24

"God. who made the world and everything in it, since He is Lord of heaven and earth, does not dwell in temples made with hands.

#### The O.T. model is "Theocracy" - church and state are intertwined.

- Biblical Israel was **not a democracy**. When Israel demanded to choose its own kings it was seen as rebellious. (1 Sam.8:1-22; 12:17)
- · Every seventh year the land was to be left for the poor by law. (Ex.23:10-11; Deut.15:1-12) 16


#### The N.T. does not call us to a Christian nation, a covenantal state, or a material kingdom.

- God's Kingdom is not of this world. (Jn.18:36)
- The Body of Christ has no walls. (1 Cor.12:13)
- Christians are aliens in this world. (1 Pet.1:1)
- Christians are ambassadors to this world. (2 Cor.5:20)

## BUT



does America have a unique covenant relationship with God that calls it to be the Christian light in the world?



### The Declaration of Independence

"We hold these Truths to be selfevident, that all Men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty, & the **Pursuit of Happiness**:—That to secure these Rights, Governments are instituted among Men, deriving their just Powers from the Consent of the governed;" (not directly from God) "Senator, when you took your oath of office, you placed your hand on the Bible and swore to uphold the Constitution. You didn't place your hand



on the Constitution and swear to uphold the Bible."

> "We are a secular nation with the soul of a church."




### "American Civil Religion" (Bellah) or "Common Faith" (Dewey)


## Note:

- All members of the U.S. Supreme Court are theists.
- We have never had an atheist president.
- Only one member of U.S. House or Senate is religiously unaffiliated.
- All sessions of congress are opened with prayer by a chaplain paid by the state.

NOTE: This affirms a respect for a generic, personal, theistic faith but it says nothing about a "Christian" nation. 23

But they are NOT distinctively Christian.


<ul> <li>Americanized Christianity is tainted by a spirit of independence from all and any external authority.</li> <li>We are suspicious of central government - We have a libertarian impulse.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Puritan Christian Nationalism</li> <li>Old Testament Israel is our story. (The O.T. is to be applied directly to our situation.)</li> <li>Political freedom is a part of the Gospel. (There was a need to justify a break from England.)</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>We are suspicious of church hierarchy - We have a local congregation mentality.</li> <li>We are suspicious of community identity -</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Providence is assurance of God's favor. (The success of the American Revolution is a sign of God's sovereign hand on America.)</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>We have a "personal" (self defined) faith.</li> <li>We are suspicious of a sovereign God - We have a god made in our image.</li> </ul>	NOTE: This was not the understanding of the authors of the American Constitution.

# In 1864 a Christian group in Xenia, Ohio proposed the following amendment to the U.S. CONSTITUTION:

"We, the people of the United States, (recognizing the being and attributes of Almighty God, the Divine authority of the Holy Scriptures, the law of God as the paramount rule, and Jesus, the Messiah, the Savior and Lord of all) in order to form a more perfect union, ..."

## Was (is) America a Christian nation?

## **Culturally YES & NO!**

- 80% profess Christian faith and many of our core values have been shaped by BIBLICAL ETHICS, (which is not the same as orthodox Christianity).

## **Constitutionally NO!**

- the Christian faith is not mentioned while enlightenment ideas of freedom from external authority prevail. My concern is that we sync the old and new covenants in our shaping of the church's role in this life and world.

- 1. We place too much hope & passion in political systems & power.
- 2. We confuse God's kingdom with American Christian Nationalism.
- 3. We are more exclusive than inclusive.
- 4. We have not respected the value of our political diversity.
