- Paul's Stoic contemporaries taught husbands to love (phileo - warm affection) their wives.
- Paul taught husbands to love (agape sacrificial service) their wives.

Three reasons

Christianity came to dominate Western civilization.

- 1. Its audience was the whole world.
- 2. Its message was uniquely powerful.
- 3. Its promise was classless.
- This paved the way for democratic governments.

Traditional gender roles were assumed to be "natural" until the modern era.

1st cent.

patriarchal culture

egalitarian

Matriarchal cultures are hard to find in human experience past or present.

Authoritarian

Men are designed to rule (as head) and women to follow (submit) in all areas of life.

Egalitarian

Roles in the home and church are determined by ability, giftedness, and calling apart from gender.

Complementarian

Men and Women have ascribed complementary and distinct roles in the home that affirm the dignity and uniqueness of each.


Unless we embrace the Word and Way of the Cross we will have a hard time embracing the N.T. teaching on gender roles.







"31 "For this cause a man shall leave his father and mother, and shall cleave to his wife; and the two shall become one flesh.""

Three mysteries are revealed

- Uniqueness #1 With marriage, the husband's responsibilities shift from one family (his parents) to another (his wife and offspring).
 In Asia for example adult children are expected to never relinquish responsibility to parents.
- Uniqueness #2 Husbands were to renew their wives to a position of dignity, honor, and equality.
 This stands in contrast to most cultures outside Judaeo Christian influence.

The third mystery

- Uniqueness #3 Marriage is a dynamic drama that mirrors Christ's relationship with the church.
 This is a mystery revealed through special revelation.
- Marriage is about more than individual fulfillment.
 It is about Emanuel and the Gospel.

The nature of HEADSHIP in marriage

- Christ is the model of "Headship" in his relationship to the church (his bride). Eph.5
- Vs 25 He "gave himself up" for the church.
- Vs 26-27 His intent was to present his bride "in all her glory".
- Vs 28-30 He "nourishes and cherishes" her as his own body.
- Vs 31 In "becoming one flesh" he affirms the need for intimacy (not being left alone).
- Vs 32-33 He sees the gender postures in marriage as a dramatic image of the relationship between "Christ and the church".

The sacrifice the husbands are asked to make for their wives exceeds the sacrifice asked of wives in their submission to husbands.

- The wife's submission involves trusting God and overcoming fear as she yields to her mate, while her husband is asked to face God as he bears responsibility in giving his life for his family.
- The husband is asked to model his life after Christ in a way the wife is not.
- The husband needs the support of his wife if he is to fulfill his calling and vice versa.

Colossians 3:19

"Husbands, love your wives and do not be **embittered** against them."

• "embittered" - "irritated", "impatient", "picky".

1 Peter 3:7

"You husbands in the same way, live with your wives in an **understanding** way, as with someone **weaker**, since she is a woman; and show her honor as a fellow heir of the grace of life, so that your prayers will not be hindered."

- · "understanding" "according to knowledge".
- "weaker" "delicate" "less recognized". As we are to give "honor" to less recognized gifts in 1 Cor.12:22-24.

Subjection / Submission to one another is a basic Christian doctrine and is a POSTURE more than a RULE.

- It is the sign of a spirit filled life along with gratitude, joyful singing, edifying speech etc.
- It is something that cannot and should not be forced on another. It is a sign of the Spirit, not a law to be followed.
- It is something that is applicable to every Christian but especially in certain areas leaders, teachers, elders, marriage, family, etc.

Implications:

The husband, like the wife, is called to sacrifice as a part of his service and witness.

- √ The husband's sacrifice is in many ways greater than that of the wife in that he bears responsibility for the family by laying aside his life. He, not the wife, is commanded, like Christ, to love (AGAPE).
- √ The husband is to serve his wife with sensitive listening in order to understand and honor her.
- √ There is no place for the husband to claim a favored position OVER his wife, with special privileges, and benefits.
- √ The husband needs his wife to support him in this heavy calling by being receptive and supportive.
