

New Book Old Question

"How the Bible Fails to Answer our Most Important Question - Why we Suffer?"



If God were truly a loving powerful God there would be heaven on earth and we can't imagine it in any other way.

Do we have the hubris to assume that the issue of human suffering can be viewed in this way only?

Bart Ehrman's thesis in "God's Problem" Why we Suffer? is convincing,

- the end of the Biblical narrative

context Context

Matthew 6

"The lamp of the body is the eye. If the eye is clear the whole body is full of light but if the eye is darkness, how great is that darkness."

Ben Anderson's story

- Entered high school with no idea of the pain and suffering that he would endure.
- He volunteered to be a part of a group that promised to be fun, and bring honor with glory to his life.
- What he got was a culture that glorified brutality, humiliation, and suffering that left him scared for life physically.
- For 3 hrs every day he would be beaten & kicked leaving him buised with broken bones and in need of reconstructive surgery.
- All of this with the complete endorsement of the school's administration.
- This school is closer to us than you think.

It's like the coach who quit because

it made no sense to him
that so much time and money was spent
on an activity that endangered
the health of young men
who played the same game every week
with 1/2 the boys leaving depressed.

Let's just declare everyone a winner and go home.

Tell me why this doesn't make sense?


"The two big advantages I had at birth were to have been born wise and to have been born in poverty."

Context frames the narrative.

Spiritual Authenticity

Witness and Ministry

2 Corinthians 1

"3 Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of mercies and God of all comfort: 4 who comforts us in all our affliction so that we may be able to comfort those who are in any affliction with the comfort with which we ourselves are comforted by God."

Could it be that we are blind & deaf to the **CONTEXT** of our brokenness and our hope?

In the end, God will post, not our medals, degrees, or accomplishments

but rather our scars, insights, faith, and witness in response to our circumstances as alien ambassadors in a fallen world.

Psalm 119:71


"It is good for me that I was afflicted. that I may learn Your statutes."

Suffering calls for, peace, power, and perseverance.

Our power is not to change our circumstances, but to respond to them as Jesus & Paul did.

Philippians 2


