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CULTIVATING COMMUNITY

- Take your baptism seriously. Don't confuse a necessary culture war with the world and an unnecessary civil war within the church.
- 2. View differing perspectives as opportunities to grow in wisdom and in witness to the world.
- 3. Grow antenna not horns. Listen, question, seek trusted leader's advice, work for consensus, and act in good faith.

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- 4. Remember that we are both "needed" & "needy".
- 5. Major on majors, minor on minors, Lighten up.

The divisive elements in community are driven by fear & those who insist they alone are right.

Does the O.C. Law
1. save us from our sins,
2. authenticate true faith,
3. are we dead to the Law?

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The Law was to underscore the message of Gen.1-3

and set the stage for the Gospel.

Was the Law given to identify those who were saved?



Man is an unworthy sinner

who is worth saving by God's grace through the Cross of Christ.

"15 ... Paul, according to the wisdom given him, wrote to you, 16 as also in all *his* letters, speaking in them of these things, in which are some things hard to understand, which **the untaught and unstable distort, as** *they do* also the rest of the Scriptures, to their own destruction."

2 Peter 3

The relationship of Paul's teaching to the O.T. can be confusing and is often misunderstood.

The problem is not the teaching but the distortion of it.

2 Timothy 2:15

"Be diligent to present yourself approved to God as a workman who does not need to be ashamed, **handling** accurately the word of truth."

1 Corinthians 13

"11 When I was a child, I used to speak as a child, think as a child, reason as a child; when I became a man, I did away with childish things. 12 For now we see in a mirror dimly, but then face to face; now I know in part, but then I will know fully just as it also have been fully known. 13 But now faith, hope, love, abide these three; but the greatest of these is love."

Expect some things to be UNCLEAR NOW.

Romans 11:33

"Oh, the depth of the riches and wisdom and knowledge of God! How **unsearchable** are his judgments and how **inscrutable** his ways!"

Faith, hope, & love should be CLEAR.

2 Peter 1:3

"seeing that His divine power has granted to us everything pertaining to life ungodliness,"

What we need to fulfill our calling is CLEAR.

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Galatians 4

"1 Now I say, as long as the heir is a child, he does not differ at all from a slave although he is owner of everything, 2 but he is under guardians and managers until the date set by the father. 3 So also we, while we were children, were held in bondage under the elemental things of the world.

4 But when the fullness of the time came, God sent forth His Son, born of a woman, born under the Law, 5 in order that He might redeem those who were under the Law, that we might receive the adoption as sons."

In what sense are we free from the Law?

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Cheap Grace

Celebrate God's love without God's justice.

Preaching grace without Christ's sacrifice.

Confessing faith without our sacrifice.

Christ died for us

and we died with him.

We are IN Christ

and Christ is IN us.

All Scripture is written FOR us, but not TO us, or ABOUT us

2 Chronicles 7:14

"and **My people** who are called by My name humble themselves and pray and seek My face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, will forgive their sin and will heal **their land**."

This text is TO and ABOUT the nation Israel NOT AMERICA.

As a principle it is applicable to the Body of Christ ONLY.







Some practical implications

The Sabbath

- · It is the only commandment, not notarized in the Epistles.
- · It is a principle that applies to all of life, not just a special day.

The Tithe

- The O.C. standard a three fold "10%" tithe (poor, Priests, temple)
- The N.C. standard is "equality" 2 Cor.8.

The nation Israel

- · There is little N.C. emphasis on Land, Temple, Jerusalem, etc.
- · The restoration of the nation Israel could be "as the church".

How should we punctuate our theological beliefs?

1 Corinthians 13

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New Covenant

Galatians 3

"12 However, the Law is not of faith; on the contrary, "He who practices them shall live by them." 13 Christ redeemed us from the curse of the Law, having become a curse for us."

Romans 3:28

"For we maintain that a man is justified by faith apart from works of the Law."

Matthew 6:15

"But if you do not forgive men, then your Father will not forgive your transgressions."

Ephesians 4:32

"And be kind to one another, tender-hearted, forgiving each other, just as God in Christ also has forgiven you."





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- → Matt.5:22-23 The Sermon on the Mount is full of warnings about failing to fulfill the spirit of the Law. "whoever shall say 'you fool' shall be guilty enough to go into the hell of fire.".
- ➡ Matt.5:29-30 "And if your right eye makes you stumble, tear it out, and throw it from you; for it is better for you that one of the parts of your body perish, than for your whole body to be thrown into hell."
- **→ Matt.7:19** "Every tree **that does not bear** good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire."

Evangelical Christians disagree as to what extent the 2nd point is essential to the 1st.



Discipleship salvation

Does a person have to display the obedience of a disciple of Christ to notarize their faith?

Discipleship salvation

- a. Not everyone who professes to be a Christian really is saved.
- b. We will know true Christians by their obedience to the moral law of God.
- c. We must come to Christ and follow after Him if He is to save us.
- d. A true believer cannot and will not live with unresolved sins in this life.

Calvinists point to the fixed decrees of God, while Arminians point to the relational dynamics of God.


Both are right in what they affirm but wrong in what they reject.
