1. This is a "main thing."

"Now I make known to you, brethren, the gospel which I preached to you, . . . For I delivered to you as **of first importance** what I also received, that **Christ died for our sins** according to the Scriptures, and that He was buried and that **He was raised** on the third day according to the Scriptures, and that he appeared to . . ."

2. This is a "historical event."

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Acts 4:33

"And with great power the apostles **were** giving testimony to the resurrection of the Lord Jesus,"

1 Corinthians 15:17

"and **if Christ has not been raised**, your faith is worthless; you are still in your sins."

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3. This "our indwelling hope."

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1 Peter 3:15

"but sanctify Christ as Lord in your hearts, always **being ready to make a defense** to everyone who asks you to give an account for **the hope that is in you**, yet with gentleness and reverence,"

The empty tomb - Jewish witnesses Matt.28:11-15

- √ Early creeds too early if a legend.
- ✓ Multiple independent witnesses Mary, Peter, 12 disciples, 500 believers.
- √ Conversion of skeptics James & Paul
- ✓ Birth & growth of the church unexpected

Why is the physical resurrection of Jesus CHALLENGED?

- 1. It is impossible A miracle is the most improbable explanation.
- 2. Its evidence is suspect The Biblical testimony is from a faith bias and is inconsistent.
- 3. It does not matter Christian faith is based upon one's subjective feelings, and Jesus' teaching on social justice.

- 1. We fail to recognize the **limits** of and **bias** in historical criticism.
- 2. Some of the **most important issues in life** will not and cannot be resolved through a scientific lens alone.
- 3. PROOF is a function of COMMITMENT based on:
 - the breadth of DATA,
 - FAITH (presuppositions) and
 - REASON (common sense logic).

Hebrews 11:3

"By faith we understand that the worlds were prepared by that word of God, so that what is seen was not made out of things which are visible."

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Challenge #2 - The Biblical testimony is inconsistent and comes from a faith bias.

- 1. The testimony does not have expected marks of bias or distortion.
- · Jesus' new body is described as unique (not easily recognized).
- · Failed to tie the accounts to the Old Testament.
- · Women were the first witnesses.
- Emphasis is on Jesus' credentials not our benefits (which came later with Paul's writing).
- The early church was unanimous and convinced of it.
- · The apostles lived for it and died for it.
- The alternative explanations are weak.

- 2. The faith did not precede the evidence but followed it.
- 3. The testimony bore the test of authenticity in the 1st century.

1 Corinthians 15:6

"After that He appeared to more than five hundred brethren at one time, most of whom remain until now, but some have fallen asleep."

- 1. The testimony does not have expected marks of bias or distortion.
- 2. The faith did not precede the evidence but followed it.
- 3. The testimony bore the test of authenticity in the 1st century.

4. The "inconsistent" testimonies can be explained.

Matthew 28:1-4

"... the angel of the heaven, came and rolled away the stone and sat on it. His face was like lightning, his robe white as snow...

Mark 16:2-5

"On entering the tomb Lord, descending from they saw a young man in a white robe seated at the right-hand side.

Luke 24:1-4

"As they stood there not knowing what to think, two men in brilliant clothes suddenly appeared at their side ... "

(Matthew 28:1-4). Later, when the women

came, they saw him there (Mark 16:2-5) and surmised what had happened. As the women were trying to make sense of all this, a second man appeared (Luke 24:1-4) and explained it.

Are the resurrection accounts really

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The Gospels were created to support the prevailing theology of Paul.

1 Corinthians 15:14

2. Inner enlightenment and social ethics are the essence of other religions, but not the basis of authentic Christianity.

Acts 17:31

"... He has fixed a day in which He will judge the world in righteousness through a Man whom He has appointed, having furnished proof to all men by raising Him from the dead."

3. The Gospel is rooted in imputed righteousness, not dramatic feelings, or social ethics.

Romans 4

"24 (righteousness) will be reckoned, as those who believe in Him who raised Jesus our Lord from the dead, 25 He who was delivered up because of our transgressions, and was raised because of our justification."

Challenge #3 - Faith is based upon subjective feelings, and Jesus' ethics.

2. Inner enlightenment and social ethics are the essence of **other religions**, but not the basis of authentic Christianity.

4. The Gospel is focused on what Christ has done not on what we must do.

Romans 4:5

"But to the one who **does not work, but believes** in Him who justifies the ungodly,
his faith is reckoned as righteousness,"

Challenge #3 - Faith is based upon subjective feelings, and Jesus' ethics.

5. A renewal of faith came as a result of the resurrection of Jesus.

1 Corinthians 15:14

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"If Christ has not been raised, our preaching is vain, your faith also is vain."

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Was the resurrection of Jesus or of faith in Jesus?

1.

The disciples had lost their faith at the cross. There is no indication that they were trying to find some reason to hang on to it.

2.

The resurrection of Jesus is described as both a historical (space time) event that resulted in an experience of hope and power.

Faith, according to I Cor.15 was based not on an existential encounter but on a historical event.

4.

Paul's writings assume that the resurrection was an established fact too soon after the event for it to be an evolved legend.

Concluding observations

1.

Most critics agree that the rational theories are problematic and unlikely but are **BETTER** than the assumption of a miracle, which is impossible.

2.

The resurrection of Jesus is the most likely explanation IF YOU ASSUME that a miracle could have happened.

3.

It is hard to imagine the formation of "the Christ of faith" WITHOUT "the Jesus of history."

4.

Proof is tied to COMMITMENT to what we sense is most PLAUSIBLE based on the evidence we have.
