
Last week Ethos and community



The Spirit's ministry is Empathetic.



Cultivating empathy

1. Get comfortable with your own feelings.
2. Show up
 - watch your body language (posture)
 - give feedback of what your heart hears
 - validate emotions
3. Listen to understand
 - don't rush to evaluate or solve a problem
 - ask searching questions
 - affirm emotions
4. Respond with personal vulnerability.
