

### Hebrews 2

"11 For both He who sanctifies and those who are sanctified are all from one Father; for which reason He is **not ashamed** to call them brethren, 12 saying, "I will proclaim Your name to My brethren, In the midst of the congregation I will sing Your praise." 13 And again, "I will put my trust in Him." And again, "Behold, I and the children whom God has given Me." 14 Therefore, since the children share in flesh and blood, He Himself likewise also partook of the same, that through death He might render powerless him who had the power of death, that is, the devil;

# Paraphrase

"Jesus shared our shame by identifying with us."

### Hebrews 2

"15 and might deliver those who through **fear of death** were subject to slavery all their lives. 16 For assuredly He does not give help to angels, but He gives help to the descendant of Abraham. 17 Therefore, He had to be made like His brethren in all things, that He might become a merciful and faithful high priest in things pertaining to God, to make propitiation for the sins of the people."

#### *Paraphrase*

"Jesus removed our shame by rendering us good enough "in Christ" by faith."

# Paraphrase

"Jesus helps us address shame by overcoming its power."

If we want to change our life, influence the life of others, and build a healthy community we must address shame.

# Philippians 2


"5 Have this attitude in yourselves which was also in Christ Jesus, 6 who, although He existed in the form of God, did not regard equality with God a thing to be grasped, 7 but emptied Himself, taking the form of a bond-servant, and being made in the likeness of men. 8 And being found in appearance as a man, He humbled Himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. 9 Therefore also God highly exalted Him, and bestowed on Him the name which is above every name,"


# The Way of the Cross

#### Hebrews 12




The shame & fear of missing out on life leads to dysfunctional, defensive, selfish, behavior.







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





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






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# How should we respond to shame?
