# Context

# Hebrews 5

"9 And having been made perfect, He became to all those who obey Him the source of eternal salvation, 10 being designated by God as a high priest according to **the order of Melchizedek**."

Jesus Christ is the Melchizedekian High Priest a unique holy, royal priest over both Jew and Gentile for all eternity.

This would be very confusing and certainly unorthodox to Jewish culture and tradition.

# Hebrews 5

"11 Concerning him (Melchizedekian Jesus) we have much to say, and it is hard to explain, since you have become dull of hearing. 12 For though by this time you ought to be teachers, you have need again for someone to teach you the elementary principles of the oracles of God, and you have come to need milk and not solid food. 13 For everyone who partakes only of milk is not accustomed to the word of righteousness, for he is a babe. 14 But solid food is for the mature, who because of practice have their senses trained to discern good and evil."

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# *Hebrews 5:11-14 (interpretive paraphrase)*

"The Melchizedekian, High Priestly, King, *Jesus* is to be understood through a Gospel message that may be hard to understand at first.

The message is "the word of righteousness" that addresses a deep longing for reconciliation with God that is generated by the image of God within every human.

This image of God includes a spiritual antenna tuned toward God that must be recognized and nurtured if we are to understand the Gospel message and find peace with God."

# 2 Peter 3

"15 and regard the patience of our Lord *as* salvation; just as also our beloved brother Paul, according to the wisdom given him, wrote to you, 16 as also in all *his* letters, speaking in them of these things, in which are **some things hard to understand**, which the untaught and unstable distort, as *they do* also the rest of the Scriptures, to their own destruction."

"The word of righteousness" is the stumbling stone in Paul's teaching?

"active and passive righteousness" the relationship of the Old & New Covenants, of faith and good works, of Jew and Gentile.

# 1 Corinthians 1:30

"But by His doing you are in Christ Jesus, who became to us wisdom from God, and righteousness and sanctification, and redemption,"

# 2 Corinthians 5:21

"He made Him who knew no sin to be sin on our behalf, so that we might become the righteousness of God in Him."

## Philippians 3:9

"and may be found in Him, not having a righteousness of my own derived from the Law, but that which is **through** faith in Christ, the righteousness which comes from God on the basis of faith,"

### Titus 3:5

"He saved us, not on the basis of deeds which we have done in righteousness, but according to His mercy, by the washing of regeneration and renewing by the Holy Spirit."

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# Understanding Paul's teaching is key to understanding Christianity.

- 1. Christianity cannot be reduced to moral ethics for this world and age.
- 2. Justifying faith is distinct from human moral virtue.
- 3. The New Covenant is not a doubling down on the Old Covenant Law.
- 4. The whole Bible is written FOR us, but not always TO or ABOUT us.



# 1 Corinthians 1



All who are in Adam die.




# Ephesians 2


