

## 1 Timothy 1

"3 As I urged you upon my departure for Macedonia, remain on at Ephesus, in order that you may instruct certain men not to teach strange (different) doctrines, 4 nor to pay attention to (get stuck on) myths (fiction) and endless genealogies, which give rise to mere speculation (mysteries) rather than furthering the administration (stewardship) of God which is by faith. 5 But the goal (end) of our instruction is love from a pure heart and a good conscience and a sincere faith."

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# What should we learn from 1 Timothy 1:3-5?

# 1. Sound doctrine is vulnerable and needs pastoral vigilance.

#### Galatians 1

"6 I am amazed that you are so quickly deserting Him who called you by the grace of Christ, for a different gospel; 7 which is really not another; only there are some who are disturbing you, and want to distort the gospel of Christ. 8 But even though we, or an angel from heaven, should preach to you a gospel contrary to that which we have preached to you, let him be accursed."

# The Christian message has always received a mixed response in this world.

#### John 1

"11 He came to His own, and those who were His own **did not receive Him**. 12 But as many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become children of God, even to those who believe in His name."

#### 1 Corinthians 1

"22 For indeed Jews ask for signs, and Greeks search for wisdom; 23 but we **preach** Christ crucified, **to Jews a stumbling block, and to Gentiles foolishness**, 24 but to those who are the called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God."

## Lessons for us

- Don't let popularity define the message or dictate ministry.
- As aliens we should expect opposition to the Gospel.
- As aliens we should NOT expect dominion in this age.



Foundation it has Fallowing it attracts. Fruit it bears.

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
## Ephesians 2:20-21

The epistles of the New Testament (Apostolic teachings) are the foundation of


Christian theology.














- 1. We are to look for and welcome the 2nd coming of Christ.

- 4. Our politics suggests that we want Christ's coming but not on his terms.


What part of the Scripture do we not believe or are unwilling to accept?

# Biblical inerrancy?

#### Mark 1:2

"As it is written in **Isaiah** the prophet, "Behold, I send My messenger before Your face, Who will prepare Your way;"

#### Malachi 3:1

"Behold, I am going to send My messenger, and he will clear the way before Me."

This quote is from Malachi, not Isaiah.



Matthew and Luke avoid this "error".

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## 2 Kings 17:37

"The statutes and the ordinances and the law and the commandment which He wrote for you, you shall observe to do **forever**;"

# Greek מולט aion, Hebrew מולט olam

These words while translated "forever" or "eternal", have various meanings including "an age" or "duration of time"

The word "forever or eternal" is used 56 times in the Old Testament in connection with things

## that have already ended or will end!

Ex.21:6, 31:16 (Heb.8:13), 1 Sam.1:22, Isa.65:17 (2 Pet.3:10) etc.
