## 1 Timothy 3




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This text could be the key to understanding 1 Timothy.

## Ephesians 4

"13 until we all attain to the unity of the faith, and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to a mature man, to the measure of the stature which belongs to the fullness of Christ. 14 As a result, we are no longer to be children, tossed here and there by waves, and carried about by every wind of doctrine, by the trickery of men, by craftiness in deceitful scheming; 15 but **speaking the truth in love**, we are to grow up in all aspects into Him, who is the head, even Christ, 16 from whom the whole body, being fitted and held together **by that which every joint supplies, according to the proper working of each individual part**, causes the growth of the body for the building up of itself in love."

- Believers are motivated and energized to use their gifts as an act of worship, when they are equipped and free to do so.

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
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## **Rules of engagement for Christians**
