

1 Timothy 4

"11 Prescribe and teach these things. 12 Let no one look down on your youthfulness, but rather in speech, conduct, love, faith and purity, show yourself an example of those who believe. 13 Until I come, give attention to the public reading of Scripture, to exhortation and teaching. 14 Do not neglect the spiritual gift within you, which was bestowed upon you through prophetic utterance with the laying on of hands by the presbytery. 15 Take pains with these things; be absorbed in them, so that your progress may be evident to all.

16 Pay close attention to yourself

GENERAL OBSERVATIONS


- We live in a culture that grades us by how we look, the skills that we have, and what we have accomplished as measured by material wealth and social respect.



This is how we bear witness to our alien statues in this world and our unique hope in the faith.


Community is a part of God's design and calls for input from all of us.

1 Samuel 16:7





2. Look at calling, not selfish ambitions.

Proper use of God's gifts:

Romans 12

"1 I urge you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies a living and holy sacrifice, acceptable to God, which is your spiritual **service of worship**."

1. is a stewardship sacrifice of worship.

2 And do not be **conformed to this world**, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, that you may prove what the will of God is, that which is good and acceptable and perfect,"

2. are not to be viewed as the world does.

3 For through the grace given to me I say to every man among you **not to think more highly of himself than he ought** to think; but to think so as to have sound judgment, as God has allotted to each a measure of faith.

3. are not to service our self esteem.

Proper use of God's gifts:

Romans 12

"6 And since we have gifts that differ according to the grace given to us, let each exercise them accordingly: if prophecy, **according to the proportion of his faith**; 7 if service, in his serving; or he who teaches, in his teaching; 8 or he who exhorts, in his exhortation; he who gives, with liberality; he who leads, with diligence; he who shows mercy, with cheerfulness."

- 4. are to respect both natural & spiritual abilities and responsibilities.
 - Do you have a passion for it?
 - Does the church affirm it?
 - Are others edified by it?

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"16 Pay close attention to yourself and to your teaching; persevere in these things; for as you do this you will ensure salvation both for yourself and for those who hear you."

Are we saved by "doing"?



Paraphrase:

Give special attention to your witness to and your orthodox teaching of the Gospel, because this is key to assurance of the salvation that it offers to all who receive it.
