

A universal challenge - SUFFERING

2 Timothy 1

"8 Therefore **do not be ashamed** of the testimony of our Lord, or of me His prisoner; but **join with me in suffering for the gospel** according to the power of God, 9 who has saved us, and called us with a holy calling, ..."

Paul does NOT ask for:

- · Relief from suffering
- · Retribution for injustice

Paul DOES ask that:

- · Timothy not be ashamed of the Gospel
- · Timothy not be afraid of suffering

A universal challenge - SUFFERING

It raises two questions

- 1. What is the nature of our hope?
- 2. How are we to read the the Old Testament with its many promises of deliverance from suffering?



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2 Timothu 2

"14 Remind them of these things, and solemnly charge them in the presence of God not to wrangle about words, which is useless, and leads to the ruin of the hearers. 15 Be diligent to present yourself approved to God as a workman who does not need to be ashamed, handling accurately the word of truth. 16 But avoid worldly and empty chatter, for it will lead to further ungodliness, 17 and their talk will spread like gangrene. Among them are Hymenaeus and Philetus, 18 men who have gone astray from the truth saying that the resurrection has already taken place, and thus they upset the faith of some. 19 Nevertheless, the firm foundation of God stands, having this seal, "The Lord knows those who are His," and, "Let everyone who names the name of the Lord abstain from wickedness."

1. What is the nature of our hope?

- Had the resurrection already taken place (spiritually)?
- Were (true) believers now living in the age of promised blessings (materially) that were to be claimed by faith?
- Or were the material blessings to come in this life through obedience to the Old Covenant Law, not a future resurrection?

The common mistake was - a misplaced hope for peace & prosperity.

NOTE: Two modern forms of misplaced hope

"Standing on the promises"

"Following the rules".

2. How are we to read the Old Testament promises of deliverance from suffering?

- The authority of the Word of God is its message, not the Bible as a new Torah.
- Avoid treating the Bible as an encyclopedia of proof texts, filtered through a personal or contemporary culture lens.
- Context, context, context, context!!!!!!
- Discern the MAJOR themes and principles.

Galatians 3:16

"Now the promises were spoken to Abraham and to his seed. He does not say, "And to **seeds**," as referring to many, but rather to one, "And to your seed," that is. Christ."

Paul is not sighting any O.T. text as a "proof text" he is interpreting the O.T.. (See also Isa.53 "suffering servant" as Jesus)

Leviticus 18:5

"So you shall keep My statutes and My judgments, by which a man may live if he does them; I am the Lord."

This promise of life (salvation) "by works" is cited by Paul in Gal.3:12-13 as standing in contrast to "by faith", where Christ's good works are imputed to the believer.

Sabbath & Circumcision were O.C. signs

Exodus 35:2

"For six days work may be done, but on the seventh day you shall have a holy day, a Sabbath of complete rest to the Lord; whoever does any work on it shall be put to death."






