2 Timothy 3 Paul's witness is in his response to suffering -

"10 But you followed my teaching, conduct, purpose, faith, patience, love, perseverance, 11 **persecutions**, and **sufferings**, such as happened to me at Antioch, at Iconium and at Lystra; what **persecutions** I endured, and out of them all the Lord delivered me! 12 And indeed, all who desire to live godly in Christ Jesus will be **persecuted**. 13 But evil men and impostors will proceed from bad to worse, deceiving and being deceived.

- which is rooted in his response to the MESSAGE of the Scripture.

14 You, however, continue in the things you have learned and become convinced of, knowing from whom you have learned them; 15 and that from childhood you have known the sacred writings, which are able to give you the wisdom that leads to salvation through faith which is in Christ Jesus. 16 All Scripture is inspired by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, for training in righteousness; 17 that the man of God may be adequate, equipped for every good work."

The message of the Cross is the issue.

1 Corinthians 1

"18 For the word of the cross is to those who are perishing foolishness, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God.... 21 For since in the wisdom of God the world through its wisdom did not come to know God, God was well-pleased through the foolishness of **the message preached** to save those who believe. 22 For indeed Jews ask for signs, and Greeks search for wisdom; 23 but we preach **Christ crucified**, to Jews a stumbling block, and to Gentiles foolishness, 24 but to those who are the called, both Jews and Greeks, **Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God**."

In spite of its naysayers, the Gospel has spread over the whole world because it is music to the soul for those with ears to hear.







Some reflective concerns

- 1. Divine revelational authority is centered more in the theological message of the Bible than in its literary precision.
- 2. Respect for the diverse literary genre of Biblical documents is important.
- 3. The integrity, heart, & discipline of the interpreter is more significant than the technical precision of the document.
- NOTE: Does a focus on absolute Inerrancy disrespect the nature of Biblical revelation and miss the purpose of its message?





2 Kings 17:37

"The statutes and the ordinances and the law and the commandment which He wrote for you, you shall observe to do **forever**;"

The word "forever or eternal" is used 56 times in the Old Testament in connection with things that have already ended or will end! Ex.21:6, 31:16 (Heb.8:13), 1 Sam.1:22, Isa.65:17 (2 Pet.3:10) etc.

The N.T. writers sometimes get the source of their O.T. quote mixed up.

Matt.27:9 (Zech.11:12-13)

"Then that which was spoken **through Jeremiah** the prophet was fulfilled, saying, 'And they took the thirty pieces of silver, the price of the one whose price had been set by the sons of Israel; and they gave them for the Potter's Field, as the Lord directed me.'"

Mk.1:2 (Mal.3:1)

"As it is written in Isaiah the prophet, '**Behold**, **I** send My messenger before Your face, who will prepare Your way;" (Note that Matthew avoids this "mistake" — Matt. 3:3.)


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N.T. writers can seem to misquote the O.T.

They often quote from the LXX (Greek copy of the Hebrew text) or paraphrase the O.T.

Matthew 12:21 (Isaiah 42:4) "and in his name will the Gentiles hope." "and the coastlands wait for his law."


Hebrews 10:30 (Deuteronomy 32:36) "The Lord will **judge** His people" "For the Lord will **vindicate** His people."



So how are we to understand the authority of the Gospel Message?

- **1. Keep the main thing, the main thing.** (The core issues of the soul, the unfolding drama of redemption, the Word and Way of the Cross.)
- 2. Respect the context (genre, literary, historical / cultural, theological, covenants, etc.)
- *3. Listen to the jury / verdict of the soul.* (the image of God = a spiritual antenna)
