• In Eph.5:32 human marriage is a picture of the ultimate marriage of Christ and his bride, the church.





# Follow the "Chief Shepherd"

1 Peter 5:2-4

"I exhort the elders to shepherd the flock of God among you, exercising oversight,

not under compulsion, but voluntarily, according to the will of God; and not for sordid gain, but with eagerness; nor yet as **lording it over** those allotted to your charge, but proving to be examples ....

And when the **Chief Shepherd** appears, you will receive the unfading **crown of glory**."

### What was Paul's Pastoral Profile?

He had a clear sense of his calling, message, and responsibility as a part of the Body of Christ.

### Ephesians 4

"11 And He gave some as apostles, and some as prophets, and some as evangelists, and some as pastors and teachers, 12 for the equipping of the saints for the work of service, to the building up of the body of **Christ**: 13 until we all attain to the unity of the faith. and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to a mature man, to the measure of the stature which belongs to the fullness of Christ. 14 As a result, we are no longer to be children, tossed here and there by waves, and carried about by every wind of doctrine, by the trickery of men, by craftiness in deceitful scheming;" 2 Tim. 1:1

### What was Paul's Pastoral Profile?

### 2 Timothy 4

"9 Make every effort to come to me soon; 10 for Demas, having loved this present world, has deserted me and gone to Thessalonica; Crescens has gone to Galatia, Titus to Dalmatia. 11 Only Luke is with me. Pick up Mark and bring him with you, for he is useful to me for service. 12 But Tychicus I have sent to Ephesus. 13 When you come bring the cloak which I left at Troas with Carpus, and the books, especially the parchments."

# He highly values and deeply appreciated the community of the Body of Christ.

"14 Alexander the coppersmith did me much harm; the Lord will repay him according to his deeds. 15 Be on guard against him yourself, for he vigorously opposed our teaching."

He taught and guarded the Christian message and community.

"16 At my first defense no one supported me, but all deserted me; may it not be counted against them. 17 But the Lord stood with me, and strengthened me, in order that through me the proclamation might be fully accomplished, and that all the Gentiles might hear; and I was delivered out of the lion's mouth. 18 The Lord will deliver me from every evil deed, and will bring me safely to His heavenly kingdom; to Him be the glory forever and ever Amen."

# He placed his ultimate faith and hope in Christ, not the community.

19 Greet Prisca and Aquila, and the household of Onesiphorus. 20 Erastus remained at Corinth, but Trophimus I left sick at Miletus. 21 Make every effort to come before winter. Eubulus greets you, also Pudens and Linus and Claudia and all the brethren. 22 The Lord be with your spirit. Grace be with you."

He was a spiritual community developer.


