The great deception

1. Fellowship with God comes through special revelation knowledge.

Our problem is not moral but mental, not sin but ignorance.

2. Walking in the Light puts us above and beyond the physical (material) world.

John is speaking TO BELIEVERS who are tempted to remove sin from the Gospel message.

1 John 1

"9 **If we confess our sins**, He is faithful and righteous to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness."

Is 1Jn.1:9 instructing carnal Christians as to how they can restore a right relationship with God?

Or is it reminding confused Christians as to how a person comes to saving faith?

Two types (contexts) of repentance.

REPENT

for FELLOWSHIP, "Saving faith" (once and for all)



- ★ The sin of unbelief
- **★** Conversion

repent

for FRUITFULNESS, "Godly discipline" (several times)



- ★ Acts of sin
- **★** Communion

Is 1 JN.1:9 is related to "REPENT" or "repent"?

- The N.T. language used with respect to our relationship with God ("forgive, cleanse from all sin") is reserved for salvation.
- "Confession" is linked to salvation 1Jn. 2:23, 4:2,3,15, 2Jn.7, Jn.1:20, 9:22, 12:42.
- Nowhere else are sinning believers to confess in order to be forgiven by God.
- An "unforgiven Christian" is an oxymoron (1Jn.2:1-2).

Paul recognizes two types of Christians.

1 Corinthians 3

"1 And I, brethren, could not speak to you as to spiritual men, but as to men of flesh, as to babes in Christ. 2 I gave you milk to drink, not solid food; for you were not yet able to receive it. Indeed, even now you are not yet able, 3 for you are still fleshly. For since there is jealousy and strife among you, are you not fleshly, and are you not walking like mere men?"

Fleshly who follow their old sin nature.

Fruitful who follow the **Spirit of Christ.**

Ephesians 4

"20 But you did not learn Christ in this way, 21 if indeed you have heard Him and have been taught in Him, just as truth is in Jesus, 22 that, in reference to your former manner of life, you lay aside the old self, which is being corrupted in accordance with the lusts of deceit, 23 and that you be renewed in the spirit of your mind, 24 and put on the new self, which in the likeness of God has been created in righteousness and holiness of the truth."



Note how Paul addresses our coming to Christ and following after Christ.

Romans 10:9

". . . if you confess with your mouth Jesus as Lord, and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved;"

Word of the Cross

Romans 12:1 "I urge you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God,

to present your bodies a living and holy sacrifice, acceptable to God, which is your spiritual service of worship."

Why do people come to Christ?

Some common answers

- · Social pressure (security) family, friends, job, etc.

1. The log in the eye problem.




"You hypocrite, first take the log out of your own eye, and then you will see clearly to take the speck out



















Never say "I love you"

The Pharisee and the Publican

Luke 18

"9 And He also told this parable to certain ones who trusted in themselves that they were righteous, and viewed others with contempt: 10 "Two men went up into the temple to pray, one a Pharisee, and the other a tax-gatherer. 11 The **Pharisee** stood and was praying thus to himself, 'God, I thank Thee that I am not like other people: swindlers, unjust, adulterers, or even like this tax-gatherer. 12 I fast twice a week; I pay tithes of all that I get."
