Christian congregations tend to fall into two categories:

4

1 John 2

"3 And by this we know that we have come to know Him, if we **keep His commandments**. 4 The one who says, "I have come to know Him," and does not keep His commandments, is a liar, and the truth is not in him; 5 but whoever **keeps His word**, in him the love of God has truly been perfected. By this we know that we are in Him: 6 the one who says he **abides in Him** ought himself to **walk in the same manner** as He walked."

A sign of an authentic Christian is walking in the same manner that Jesus walked.

Note what John does not mention as a sign of "knowing Christ".

- · Conformity to a doctrinal tradition.
- Partaking of sacramental events water baptism.
- Dramatic emotional encounter with God (second blessing or Spirit baptism).
- · Faithful participation in a religious group.

What does John mention?

"walk in the same manner that Jesus did"
"abide in him", "keep His commandments"

Some practical questions.

- Can we have assurance of authentic fellowship with God if we sin - fail to keep all his commandments? (How is this consistent with what John just said in 1:8?)
- Which "commandments" does John have in mind? (Mosaic Law, avoiding Gentiles, sermon on the mount hyperboles, etc.)



Two challenges to orthodoxy in the early ch.

Colossians 2

"16 Therefore let no one act as your judge in regard to food or drink or in respect to a festival or a new moon or a Sabbath day — 17 things which are a mere shadow of what is to come; but the substance belongs to Christ.

Living under the Law of Moses.

Galatians 4

"4 But when the fullness of the time came, God sent forth His Son, born of a woman, born under the Law, 5 in order that He might redeem those who were under the Law, that we might receive the adoption as sons."

Living outside Apostolic teaching.

1 Corinthians 4:6

"so that in us you may learn not to exceed what is written, so that no one of you will become arrogant in behalf of one against the other."

Jesus summarized kingdom ethics as one commandment with two rules.

Matthew 22

"36 Teacher, which is the great commandment in the Law?" 37 And He said to him, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind. 38 This is the great and foremost commandment. 39 The second is like it, You shall love your neighbor as yourself. 40 On these two commandments depend the whole Law and the Prophets.""

John echoes this teaching in ch.3.

1 John 3

"23 And this is His commandment, that we believe in the name of His Son Jesus Christ, and love one another, just as He commanded us. 24 And the one who keeps His commandments abides in Him, and He in him. And we know by this that He abides in us, by the Spirit whom He has given us.

To love God is to "walk in the Spirit" - believe in His Son and love all who bear God's image, starting within the community of faith (Gal.6:10).

John indicates that the commandment is to love all those that God loves.

John 13

"34 A new commandment I give to you, that you **love** one another, even **as I have loved** you, that you also love one another. 35 By this all men will know that you are My disciples, if you have love for one another.""

The newness of the commandment has to do with two things:

Jesus' outward example
 Jesus' indwelling Spirit

"All these died in faith, without receiving the promises, but having seen them and having welcomed them from a distance, and having confessed that they were **strangers and exiles** on the earth."

Matthew 22:21

"Render to Caesar the things that are Caesar's and to God the things that are God's."

"Ambassador walking" check list

- Am I more concerned about changing my circumstances than I am about my response to them?
- Are those who watch my life sensing a joy, peace, & freedom or fear, anger, and despair?
- Am I taking responsibility for things I can't control?

Matthew 6

"24 **No one can serve two masters**; for either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will hold to one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and mammon. 25 For this reason I say to you, **do not be anxious for your life**, as to what you shall eat, or what you shall drink; nor for your body, as to what you shall put on. Is not life more than food, and the body than clothing?"

It is focused, faithful, and fearless.


The question is not do we work on the Sabbath but do we bring the Sabbath to our work.
