

Scripture reminds us that security, significance & serenity are not synced to external circumstances.

- Prodigal son.
- Martha and Mary.
- Paul's thorn in the flesh.
- · Joseph's captivity in Egypt.
- Jesus' crucifixion and resurrection.

At the end of Jesus' ministry he prayed for...

John 17

"15 I do not ask Thee to take them out of the world, but to **keep them from the evil one**. 16 They are not of the world, even as I am not of the world. 17 Sanctify them in the truth; Thy word is truth. 18 **As Thou didst send Me into the world, I also have sent them into the world**. 19 And for their sakes I sanctify Myself, that they themselves also may be sanctified in truth. 20 I do not ask in behalf of these alone, but for those also who believe in Me through their word; 21 that they may all be one; even as Thou, Father, art in Me, and I in Thee, that they also may be in Us; that the world may believe that Thou didst send Me."

Observations from this passage:

1. Jesus does not ask that his followers change (reform) the world.

2. Jesus does not call them to exorcise Satan out of the world.

3. Jesus expects them to struggle, as aliens in this life, as he did.



4. Jesus' goal is for them to promote the Word and Way of the Cross through the unified Body of Christ.

1. What is at the heart of worldliness?

1 John 2

"15 Do not love the world, nor the things in the world. If anyone loves the world, the love of the Father is not in him. 16 For all that is in the world, the **lust of the flesh and the lust of the eyes and the boastful pride of life**, is not from the Father, but is from the world. 17 And the world is **passing away**, and also its lusts; but the one who does the will of God **abides forever**."

Worldliness is an internal spiritual virus, not an external material circumstance.

One of the worst mistakes we make is to treat worldliness as something outside our heart.

Matthew 15:18

"But the things that proceed out of the mouth come from the heart, and **those defile the man.**"

Matthew 23:27

"Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! For you are like whitewashed tombs which on the outside appear beautiful, **but inside** they are full of dead men's bones and all uncleanness."



A worldly spirit is:

1. Sensually oriented "Lust of the flesh" (driven by "bread alone" rather than by the Word and Way of the Cross)

1 Corinthians 15:19

"If we have hoped in Christ in this life only, we are of all men most to be pitied."

Christ did not come to help us find our kingdom in this world.

A worldly spirit is:

- **1. Sensually oriented** *"Lust of the flesh"* (driven by "bread alone" rather than by the Word and Way of the Cross)
- 2. Short sighted "Lust of the eye" ("walking by sight" rather than faith)

2 Corinthians 5:7 "for we walk by faith, not by sight"



Walking in the light starts with facing in the right direction. A worldly spirit is:

- **1. Sensually oriented** *"Lust of the flesh"* (driven by "bread alone" rather than by the Word and Way of the Cross)
- 2. Short sighted "Lust of the eye" ("walking by sight" rather than faith)
- 3. Superficially satisfied "Pride of life" (settling for not being fully human after the image of Adam, not Christ)

"There was the true Light which, coming into the world, enlightens every man."


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This is the heart of "worldly wisdom".




Worldliness is to displace God and His kingdom with our own goals and plans.

James 4



Christ came to save our souls not our plans.











A false messiah's focus is superficial.


"So I tell you this, and insist on it in the Lord, that you must no longer **live** as the Gentiles do, in the futility of their thinking."
