"1 Whoever **believes** that Jesus is the Christ is born of God: and whoever loves the Father **loves** the child born of Him. 2 By this we know that we **love** the children of God, when we love God and observe His commandments. 3 For this is the love of God, that we keep His commandments; and His commandments are not burdensome. 4 For whatever is born of God **overcomes** the world; and this is the **victory** that has **overcome** the world — our **faith**. 5 Who is the one who **overcomes** the world, but he who **believes** that Jesus is the Son of God?"

1 John 5 (interpretive paraphrase)

"1 To be a Christian, one must believe that Jesus is our hope. 2 We affirm our faith through our love for those whom God loves. 3 God loves others through us and we are glad to to do so as a sign that we love God.

"4 As Christians, we stand against a world order that is an enemy of those who bear God's image. 5 We do this as we hold fast to our faith in Jesus and follow him in the Word and Way of the Cross."

Revelation 2-3 (the seven churches)

"7 To him who overcomes, I will grant to eat of the tree of life which is in the Paradise of God. . . . 11 He who overcomes will not be hurt by the second death. . . . 17 To him who overcomes, to him I will give some of the hidden manna, . . . 26 He who overcomes, and he who keeps my deeds until the end, to him I will give **authority** over the nations; . . . 3:5 He who overcomes will thus be clothed in white garments; and I will not erase his name from the book of life, and I will confess his name before my Father and before His angels. . . . 12 He who overcomes, I will make him a pillar in the temple of my God, . . . 21 He who overcomes, I will grant to him to sit down with me on my throne, as I also overcame and sat down with my Father on his throne." 5

The temptation of Christ (Matt.4:1-11)

- 1. Priorities A materialistic, rather than spiritual perspective.
- 2. Expectations A libertarian / rights sense of entitlement.
- 3. Lifestyle A transactional (ends justify means) MO.

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The schemes of the Devil?

1. "Fake news" telling us that our problems are outside our soul as material, sociopolitical, economic, psychological.

This gets us in trouble.

2. "False hopes" telling us that military muscle, power politics, economic prosperity, & inner light hold the answers.

This keeps us from real solutions.

Ephesians 6:12

"For our struggle is not against **flesh and blood**, but against the rulers, against the powers, against the world forces of this darkness, against the **spiritual forces** of wickedness in the **heavenly places**."

The temptation to place hope in this world.

- Political power will bring in God's kingdom.
- Military strength will give us security.
- Christian laws will reform humanity.
- Material prosperity will bring social peace and justice.
- An educated world will bring humanity to its senses.
- An organized church will unify the Body of Christ.


Overcomers

- observe that there are phenomena in this world and longings in the human heart that are hard to explain apart from the spiritual dimension.


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"Christianity spread not just among the poor who sought hope beyond the material suffering of this life but also among the rich who found that material wealth could not satisfy the soul."

But NOTE: When the law is written on the heart (Jer.31:33-34) it is no longer an

ANNOYING CHORE, even when it is challenging

and demands sacrifice.

✓ He is speaking as a "son to a father" not "slave to a master".


It is OUR faith reception of Christ's work for us stemming from the grace of God's image in us.

Carter Pardons Draft Dodgers






• Many young people had fled to Canada to escape being drafted to Vietnam

 On his 1st day as President, Carter fully pardoned all draft dodgers
 An estimated 50,000 draft dodgers chose to remain Canadian even after pardon

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Ephesians 2:8-9

"we are saved by grace through **faith** and **that** not of yourselves, it is the **gift of God** not as a result of works, so that no one may boast."

The "gift of God" **refers to salvation not faith as in Rom.6:23** "but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord."

The Greek "that" (neuter) does not link to "faith" (feminine) making it more likely that the whole of salvation is in view.

"For by grace you have been saved through faith, that is to say, not of yourselves, it (salvation) is the gift of God." 22

Overcomers are liberated

NOT FROM:

- suffering material impediments to OUR plans and expectations in this life
- sin moral imperfections that fall short of the glory of God in this life

BUT FROM:

 servitude to a mindset that mocks the Word and Way of the Cross
