




Exodus 20:3 "You shall have no other gods before Me."





είδωλολατρία Greek (Image + serve) "Therefore concerning, the sating of things sacrificed to idols, we know that there is no **such thing as an idol in the world**, and that there is no cod but one."

How should Christians address politics and faith.



- Our alien status
 is displayed most clearly
 in our church / state posture.
 - It is unwise to wed the kingdom of God to a political party or philosophy.
 - It is worse to fail to address the idolatry of wedding Christian faith, hope, and love to politics.
 - In the end it's always between us and God not us and them.

- Christian nationalism Should we view America as an extension of God's kingdom?
 - Social reform Have did Jesus and his Apostles model and teach it?
 - **Rendering to Caesar** What does that mean for Americans?

Genesis 11




The Tower of Babel "doubles down" on "the Fall of Adam".

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Romans 12


"1 I urge you therefore, brethren by the mercies of God, to **present** your bodies a living and holy sacrifice, acceptable to God, which is your spiritual service of worship. 2 And **do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind**, that you may prove what the will of God is, that which is good and acceptable and perfect."

Idolatry ends when we take our baptism seriously.

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James 4

"2 You lust and do not have because you do not ask. 3 You ask and do not receive, because you ask with **wrong motives**, so that you may spend it on your pleasures."



Matthew 6

"22 The lamp of the body is the eye; if therefore your eye is clear, your whole body will be full of light. 23 But if your eye is bad, your whole body will be tull of darkness. If therefore the light that is in you is darkness, how great is the darkness! 24 No one can serve two masters, for either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will hold to one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and mammon."

Idolatry ends when we stop serving two masters.

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
Galatians 6



Idolatry ends when we sow to the Spirit not the flesh.

Matthew 6

"¹⁹ Do not lay up for yourselves treasures upon earth, where moth and rust destroy, and where thieves break in and steal. ²⁰ But lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where betther moth nor rust destroys, and where thieves do not break in or steal; ²¹ for where your treasure is, there will your heart be also."





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
