- · Faith (verb) unites us "in Christ" who is "the Image of God".
- Faith (noun) is the message of God's Image being fully restored in humans.

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2 Peter 1

"1 Simon Peter, a bond-servant and apostle of Jesus Christ, to those who have received a faith of the same kind as ours, by the righteousness of our God and Savior, Jesus Christ:"

Faith (VERB) - the act of believing.

Faith (NOUN) - the message believed.

What message did we RECEIVE?

"2 Grace and peace be multiplied to you in the knowledge of God and of Jesus our Lord, 3 for His divine power has granted to us everything pertaining to life and godliness, through the true knowledge of Him who called us by His own glory and excellence (virtue). 4 For by these He has granted to us His precious and magnificent promises, so that by them you may become partakers of the divine **nature**, having escaped the corruption that is in the world on account of lust. '

Genesis 1-3 reveals humanities purpose and problem.

Genesis 1:26


"Let Us make man in Our image, according to Our likeness: and let them rule."

2 Peter 1

"3 for **His divine power has granted to us** everything pertaining to life and godliness, through the true knowledge of Him who called us by His own glory and excellence. 4 Through these (**His nature - power, glory, and virtue**) He has granted to us His precious and magnificent **promises**, so that by them you may become **partakers of** *the* **divine nature**, having escaped the corruption that is in the world on account of lust."

God calls us BY His nature, TO partake of His nature, as promised in the O.T. and realized in Christ.

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What changes

when a person becomes a Christian?

- √ Some things may change immediately, completely, and irrevocably. (our position in Christ, our direction in life)
- √ Some things may not change at all. (personality, physical body, formative circumstances, etc.)
- √ Some things may change gradually and incompletely. (wisdom, spiritual maturity, moral perfection, character, etc.)

2 Peter 1

"for you are **still fleshly**. For since there is jealousy and strife among you, are you not fleshly, and are you not **walking like mere men?**"



2. Confusing the work of Christ and the work of the Spirit





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
The O.C. and N.C. differ with respect to how to acquire the virtue that God's Image demands.



Our position "in Christ"

is about the finished work of Christ FOR us through God's GRACE

and the imputed virtue of Christ TO us through our FAITH (baptism).

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Genesis 15:6

"Then he believed in the Lord; and He reckoned it to him as righteousness."

Imputation

- The attribution of a value to something that ordinarily does not have that value.
- To "consider" or "see as" so. (It is reckoned as truth rather than a sensate experience).

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This had to do with his official position not his personal virtue.


Water baptism is your positional washing as a believer priest.


"... baptism now saves you, not the washing of the filth of the flesh but

Why Positional truth is important

- √ It is clearly taught in the Old and New Testaments.
- ✓ It is at the heart of the Gospel.

√ It puts the attention on what God has done in Christ not on our merit / virtue.



✓ It grounds our relationship in what is finished (secure) not in our feelings or circumstances.

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Our position "in Christ" frees us from fear.

Romans 7-8

"24 Wretched man that I am! Who will set me free from the body of this death? 25 Thanks be to God through Jesus Christ our Lord! . . . 1 There is therefore now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus. . . . 3 For what the Law could not do, weak as it was through the flesh, God did; sending His own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh and as an offering for sin, He condemned sin in the flesh,"


Without Positional truth

- ✓ Our relationship with Christ is unsettled.
- √ Christians can have little assurance.
- √ Christianity is all about me and my life.
- ✓ Christians live in constant fear of failure.
- √ The Old Covenant is still operational.
- √ Legalism and judging others is encouraged.
- √ The focus of the faith becomes our works.

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No one is forced to receive Christ but all must bear God's image to be reconciled to Him!

- We are all created in the image of God for a purpose of bearing His virtue.
- 2. We are responsible to be true to ourselves as image bearers.
- 3. We are frustrated by our brokenness and that of the world.
- 4. Jesus was sent as a gift of grace to bear our shame on the cross and impute His moral virtue to us by faith.
- Many have received God's gift by faith so as to stand before God as a perfect image bearer in Christ.
- 6. Others are free to stand before God on their own merit.
- 7. God will be perfectly fair in His judgment of both.



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
