




The first negative human emotion expressed in the Bible

Genesis 3:10

"I was afraid because I was naked; so I hid myself."

We fear the circumstances and consequences of failing to honor God.



The Biblical narrative is about life and death / peace and fear.

Hebrews 2:14-15

"... He Himself likewise also partook of the same, (flesh and blood) that He ... might free those who through fear of death were subject to slavery all their lives."

Romans 8

"15 For you have **not received a spirit of slavery leading to fear again**, but you have received a spirit of adoption as sons by which we cry out, "Abba! Father!" 16 The Spirit Himself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God,"



is perhaps the most powerful negative emotion in affecting spiritual decisions.

A heart full of fear will lead us to make defensive decisions.

Deflect

If we lead with hope & faith our hearts will follow with joy, peace, and freedom.

Aliens are spiritually secure through the Word of the Cross, more than the Way of the Cross.

2 Peter 2

Identifying the wolves among the sheep

"15 **abandoning** the right way, they have **gone astray**, having followed the way of **Balaam**, **the son of Beor**, who loved the reward of unrighteousness;"

 Balaam (a Gentile prophet) who turned on Israel after speaking for Israel.
 Num. 22-31, Rev. 2:14

It's hard to bribe a fearless person.

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17 These are springs without water and mists driven by a storm, for whom the black darkness has been reserved. 18 For, while speaking out arrogant *words* of no value they entice by fleshly desires, by indecent behavior, those **who barely escape from** the ones who live in error, 19 promising them freedom while they themselves are slaves of corruption; for by what anyone is overcome, by this he is enslaved."

The shepherd's role is to equip the sheep to recognize and resist the predators.

20 For if, after they have escaped the defilements of the world by the knowledge of the Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, they are again entangled in them and are overcome, the last state has become worse for them than the first. 21 For it would be better for them not to have known the way of righteousness, than having known it, to turn away from the holy commandment handed on to them. 22 It has happened to them according to the true proverb, "A dog returns to its own vomit," and, "A sow, after washing, returns to wallowing in the mire.""

Both the "knowledge of Christ" and escape from worldly corruption describe a Christian.

2 Peter 1

"3 for His divine power has granted to us everything pertaining to life and godliness, through the **true knowledge of Him** who called us by His own glory and excellence. 4 Through these (glory and excellence) He has granted to us His precious and magnificent **promises**, so that by them you may become **partakers of** *the* **divine nature**, having **escaped** the corruption that is in the world on account of lust."

The same words are used in vs.20 of the predators.

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Observations and Questions

The false teachers were receptive to the Gospel at one time but later turned away.

The untaught and unstable believers are most vulnerable and can be led astray.

Is the apostasy one of faith (Word of the Cross), ethics (Way of the Cross) or both?

The basis of the believer's security

- The loving intent of God the Father.
- · The finished redemption of God the Son.
- The indwelling comfort of God the Spirit.
- The faith of God's people in the Gospel message.

Apostasy is real

· Some people repent of their faith confession.

Some false basis for security

- · Membership in a church
- · Confession of faith & water baptism
- Diligence in good works and moral discipline
- Signs and wonders, fruitful ministry, good witness 14

Can a "born again" Christian turn away from the faith (Word & Way) and be lost?

- The serious warnings and language of the N.T. raises that question.
- The Apostolic teaching of the N.T. concerning the Word of the Cross is the Gospel and is quite clear - salvation is by grace through faith apart from human merit (good works).
- But how is the Way of the Cross (ethics) related to the Word of the Cross? Are they inseparable?



True faith changes the heart (which only God can see) and leads to fruit that (man can see)


Ephesians 2

10 For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus **for good works**, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them."



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Five concerns

If our security rests in OUR following the Way of the Cross

- 1. It is not good news for mortals.
- 2. It will be about my merit not Christ.
- 3. It makes my fate uncertain.
- 4. It invites pride, shame, and fear.
- 5. It cheapens the Glory of God.

Lessons to be learned

- 1. Faith Salvation in Christ is offered to all who truly believe and persevere IN FAITH (not works).
- 2. Works We obey in response to our security in Christ, through faith, which is not a "meritorious work".
- 3. Apostasy If we turn from our faith, we forfeit our experience of hope and recognition as Christians.
- 4. False believers Not all who appear to be Christians truly believe and some who start believing do not finish.
- 5. Warnings We must nurture faith and persevere in it lest we fall from grace and incur God's discipline.

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Hebrews 6:1

"Therefore leaving the elementary teaching about the Christ, let us press on to maturity, not laying again a foundation of repentance from dead works and of faith toward God."

Saving faith
