





1 Corinthians 1

"23 but we preach Christ crucified, to Jews a stumbling block, and to Gentiles foolishness, 24 but to those who are the called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God."

2 Peter 1

"20 But know this first of all, that no prophecy of Scripture becomes a matter of someone's own interpretation, 21 for no prophecy was ever made by an act of human will, but men moved by the Holy Spirit spoke from God."

The authority of the Gospel

- Does not rest primarily in the inerrancy of the Bible - Protestant fundamentalism.
- Does not rest primarily in the authority of the church Roman Catholicism.
- Does not rest in the culture of the readers -Protestant liberalism.
- It rests primarily in the power of the message itself - in its appeal to the image of God in humanity.

Romans 2:15

"they show the work of the Law written in their hearts, their conscience bearing witness and their thoughts alternately accusing or else defending themselves,"

Romans 8:16

"The Spirit himself testifies with our spirit that we are children of God."

God's Spirit touches the image of God in us to notarize the message of the Gospel.

Lessons

- The authority and power of the Word is in the message itself, and does not demand a precise inerrancy of the Biblical text.
- The N.T. contains the Apostles' message.
 It is not the kind of message that a Jew or Gentile would invent nor a narrative that man would write.
- When we give an account of our hope, we appeal to the power of the message.

1 Peter 3:15 "being ready to make a defense to everyone who asks you to give an account for the hope that is in you"

How do we give an account?

2 Peter 3

"15 just as also our beloved brother **Paul**, according to the wisdom given him, wrote to you, 16 as also in all *his* letters, ... which the untaught and unstable distort, as *they do* also **the rest of the Scriptures**,"

• The witness of God through the Scriptures properly understood.

Acts 5:32

"And we are witnesses of these things; and **so is the Holy Spirit**, whom God has given to those who obey Him."

The witness of the Spirit to our spirit.

Be a Berean - learn how to read the Scripture and don't duck your responsibility to own your faith. 2 Timothy 2:15

"Be diligent to present yourself approved to God as a workman who does not need to be ashamed, accurately handling the word of truth."

Rightly reading the Scripture is not a matter of special revelation, subjective impulse, or blindly following the crowd or a leader.

Be careful who you listen to.
