
"I don't need more information, I need certainty."

How can I know God's Will? (a traditional view)

Usually our heart gets set on what we want and we turn to God to make it happen.

- 1. Get right with God.
- 2. Pray for the desires of your heart.
- 3. Look for confirmation in Scripture.
- 4. Expect guidance through unusual signs.
- 5. Expect inner peace with your decision.
- 6. Expect your decision to bear fruit.

Trials call for Wisdom.

James 1

"2 Consider it all joy, my brothers and sisters, when you encounter various trials, 3 knowing that the testing of your faith produces endurance. 4 And let endurance have its perfect result, so that you may be perfect and complete, lacking in nothing.

5 But if any of you lacks wisdom, let him ask of God, who gives to all generously and without reproach, and it will be given to him. 6 But he must ask in faith without any doubting, for the one who doubts is like the surf of the sea, driven and tossed by the wind. 7 For that person ought not to expect that he will receive anything from the Lord, 8 being a double-minded man, unstable in all his ways."

Wisdom is an internal management of external matters and material.

Questions related to knowing God's will

- 1. Is God's sovereign control comprehensive or occasional?
- 2. Is our relationship with God dynamic & synergistic or controlled and rule driven?
- 3. Is there a perfect will or plan that we must find if we are to be fully blessed in this life?

How did the early church respond?

Acts 15

"7 And after there had been much debate, . . . 28 For it seemed good to the Holy Spirit and to us. . . . 15 And with this the words of the Prophets agree, just as it is written, (Amos 9:12)"

Wisdom is a dynamic multi resources responsibility, not a passive search for signs or feelings.

Observation #1 - After Pentecost, there is no mention of prayer for special revelation, a Biblical rule (proof text) for guidance, or turning to a strong-man leader for all the answers.

Observation #2 - There is a sensitivity to both general and special revelation.


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












Hebrews 8

"10 For this is the covenant which I will make with the house of Israel after those days, declares the Lord: I will put My laws into their minds, and write them on their hearts. And I will be their God, and they shall be My people. 11 And they will not teach, each one his fellow citizen, and each one his brother, saying, 'Know the Lord,' for they will all know Me, from the least to the greatest of them. . . . 13 When He said, "A new covenant," He has made the first obsolete. But whatever is becoming obsolete and growing old is about to disappear."

The New Covenant initiated with the inner gift of Christ's Spirit replaces the Old Covenant with its emphasis on outward rules.

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This is illustrated in decisions made before Pentecost.

Acts 1

(discerning a replacement for Judas) "24 And they prayed, and said, "Thou, Lord, who knowest the hearts of all men, show which one of these two Thou hast chosen 25 to occupy this ministry and apostleship from which Judas turned aside to go to his own place." 26 And they drew lots for them, and the lot fell to Matthias; and he was numbered with the eleven apostles."

The emphasis is on external rules and special signs or prophets to reveal God's will.

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2 Corinthians 3:6

"who also make us adequate as servants of a **new** covenant, not of the letter but of the Spirit;"

"13 But when he, the Spirit of truth, comes he will guide you into all the truth; . . . 14 He will glorify me, for he will take of mine and will disclose it to you."

Examples of Wisdom in decision making

- Marriage 1 Cor. 7:39 "A wife is bound as long as her husband lives; but if her husband is dead, she is free to be married to whom she wishes, only in the Lord."

- 3. **Sabbath** *Rom. 14:5* "One man regards one day above another, another regards every day alike. Let each man be **fully convinced in his own mind.**"

Help for making mature decisions.

1. The indwelling Spirit of Christ equips us to wisely respond to life's circumstances.

1 Cor. 1:33 "But by His (God's) doing you are in Christ Jesus, who became to us wisdom from God,"

- The Word of the Cross assures us that we are loved, accepted, and not alone.
- The Way of the Cross gives us models to follow in Jesus and his Apostles.
- The Body of Christ provides a broad context of counsel, assurance, and support.
- The Image of God creates a moral conscience of human dignity and common sense.

2. God's will is a COMPASS more than a road map.

 God's will has to do with our direction and destination than with every detailed decision.

1 Cor. 7:39 "she is free to be married to whom she wishes, only in the Lord."



3. Facing in the right DIRECTION makes it easier to find the path.

- Strategic (macro) decisions set the stage for good tactical (micro) decisions.
- We must take our baptism seriously.



4. Staying in OUR place keeps us in the race.

- We must not take responsibility for things we can't control or are none of our business.
- We are not the composer, or conductor.
 But we do have a part and an instrument.



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- We must not take responsibility for things we can't control or are none of our business.
- We are not the composer, or director.
 We have an instrument & a specific part.



- That instrument is not the organ, where we are the only one needed.
- We need to spend less time critiquing how others play their instrument and spend more time mastering ours.

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Rules of engagement for Christians

- 1. Take responsibility only for things we can control, like our response to circumstances.
- 2. Work and pray for that which will not perish godly character and gracious community.

The main thing is to keep the main thing, the main thing.

We should pray for God's will and plan not ours.

Rules of engagement for Christians
