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Basic observations

- Jesus' favored teaching style seemed to be the parable.
- Jesus' parables appear only in the synoptic gospels (Matthew, Mark, & Luke).
- Jesus was speaking to:
 - 1. those under the Law,
 - 2. Jews only, and
 - 3. a spiritual mixed audience.
- Parables were used to reveal:
 - 1. aspects of the Kingdom, indirectly
 - 2. to ears that were open or closed.
- Parables were most often a response to a specific issue.

If Jesus was Israel's "Messiah":

- why had nothing changed for Israel?
- why did Israel's leaders reject him?
- why did he not conform to the Law?

Luke 8

"4 And when a great multitude were coming together, and those from the various cities were journeying to Him, He spoke by way of a parable: 5 The sower went out to sow his seed; and as he sowed, some fell beside the road; and it was trampled under foot, and the birds of the air ate it up. 6 And other seed fell on rocky soil, and as soon as it grew up, it withered away, because it had no moisture. 7 And other seed fell among the thorns; and the thorns grew up with it, and choked it out. 8 And other seed fell into the good soil, and grew up, and produced a crop a hundred times as great." As He said these things, He would call out, "He who has ears to hear, let him hear."

Luke 8

"9 And His disciples began questioning Him as to what this parable might be. 10 And He said, "To you it has been granted to know the mysteries of the kingdom of God, but to the rest it is in parables, in order that 'seeing they may not see, and hearing they may not understand'."

"11 Now the parable is this: the seed is the word of God. 12 And those beside the road are those who have heard; then the devil comes and takes away the word from their heart, so that they may not believe and be saved. 13 And those on the rocky soil are those who, when they hear, receive the word with joy; and these have no firm root; they believe for a while, and in time of temptation fall away. 14 And the seed which fell among the thorns, these are the ones who have heard, and as they go on their way they are choked with worries and riches and pleasures of this life, and bring no fruit to maturity. 15 And the seed in the good soil, these are the ones who have heard the word in an honest and good heart, and hold it fast, and bear fruit with perseverance."

Luke 8:4-15 The Parable of the soils




- √ Alongside the road (it is timed out)
- √ On the rocky places (it is starved out)
- √ Among the thorns (it is crowded out)
- √ On the good soil (it is patient, persevering, a priority, & fruitful)

It could be the seed (message).


(The Biblical story too often is distorted, or treated as a myth.)


Some "sacred cows" that reflect our world & not God's kingdom.

Why does the Gospel get mixed reviews?

Some times its the seed? Some times its the sower?

It is always the soil.

(This parable focuses attention on the hearer.)

What makes the "bad soils" bad?

"Poor farming methods"

- Poor soil preparation.
- Lack of nourishment and support.
- Keeping the weeds out.



 Attention to faith over time is needed for fruit bearing.

What should we learn from this?

- Cultivate expectations that are sound based on insight into the Kingdom.
- The Christian life is a group process in a healthy spiritual community.
- Take responsibility for things you can and should control - don't cause others to
- Don't take responsibility for things you cannot control - the response of others.
