


Matthew 22

"1 And Jesus answered and spoke to them again in parables, saying, 2 "The kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king, who gave a wedding feast for his son. 3 And he sent out his slaves to call those who had been invited to the wedding feast, and they were unwilling to come. 4 Again he sent out other slaves saving, 'Tell those who have been invited," Behold, I have prepared my dinner; my oxen and my fattened livestock are all butchered and everything is ready; come to the wedding feast."' 5 But they paid no attention and went their way, one to his own farm, another to his business, 6 and the rest seized his slaves and mistreated them and killed them. 7 But the king was enraged and sent his armies, and destroyed those murderers, and set their city on fire."

"8 Then he said to his slaves, The wedding is ready, but those who were invited were **not worthy**. 9 Go therefore to the main highways, and as many as you find there, invite to the wedding feast.' 10 And those slaves went out into the streets, and gathered together all they found, both evil and good; and the wedding hall was filled with dinner guests. 11 But when the king came in to look over the dinner guests, he saw there a man not dressed in wedding clothes, 12 and he said to him, 'Friend, how did you come in here without wedding clothes?' And he was speechless. 13 Then the king said to the servants, 'Bind him hand and foot, and cast him into the outer darkness; in that place there shall be weeping and gnashing of teeth. 14 For many are called, but few are chosen."

The context of the parables in Matt.21-22

- 1. Jesus enters Jerusalem and cleanses the temple of the money changers.
- 2. Jesus' authority is challenged by the religious leaders of his day.
- 3. Jesus responds with three parables that explain why God's kingdom is taken away from Israel and given to others.
 - The delinquent SON refuses to work after saying he will.
 - The delinquent TENANT refuses to turn over the harvest to the owner after working.



Jesus is speaking prophetically to Israel (and the world).

- · The king is God.
- The son is Messiah (Jesus).
- The invited quests are Israel.
- The slaves are God's prophets.
- The punishment is exile.
- The outsiders are Gentiles.
- The proper clothes are a ticket.
 - The outer darkness is exclusion.


What does it mean to be "chosen", "worthy", or have "proper wedding clothes"?

- 1. These three expressions seem related.
- 2. Being "chosen" (elected) is connected to being "receptive" to the King's call to the feast.
- It also requires being "properly" dressed for the feast.


Paul's letter to the Romans provides a commentary on this parable.

Some common but false beliefs that will exclude people from the wedding feast:



Luke 16

"15 And He (Jesus) said to them (leaders of Israel), "You are those who justify yourselves in the sight of men, but God knows your hearts; for that which is highly esteemed among men is detestable in the sight of God. 16 The Law and the Prophets were proclaimed until John; since then the gospel of the kingdom of God is preached, and everyone is forcing his way into it."

False belief #1 Faith is a gift to the elect only.

Romans 11

"8 just as it is written, "God gave them a spirit of stupor, Eyes to **see not** and ears to **hear not**, down to this very day." 9 And David says, "Let their table become a snare and a trap, and a stumbling block and a retribution to them. 10 Let their eyes be **darkened to see not**, and bend their backs forever.""

Israel's insight shaped the object of her faith.

It is insight and ears to hear that shape saving faith.

"1 Brethren, my heart's desire and my prayer to God for them is for their salvation. 2 For I bear them witness that they have a **zeal for God, but not in accordance with knowledge**. 3 For not knowing about God's righteousness, and seeking to establish their own, they did not subject themselves to the righteousness of God. 4 For Christ is the end of the law for righteousness to everyone who believes.""


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False belief #3 The Law was given to confirm who was acceptable before God.

Romans 3

"19 Now we know that whatever the Law says, it speaks to those who are under the Law, that every mouth may be closed, and all the world may become accountable to God; 20 because by the works of the Law no flesh will be justified in His sight; for through the Law comes the knowledge of sin."

God's Law is given to convict us not to confirm us.


False belief #4 The Gospel of Jesus rests in his ethical teaching and example.

Romans 3

"21 But now apart from the Law the righteousness of God has been manifested, being witnessed by the Law and the Prophets, 22 even the righteousness of God through faith in **Jesus Christ** for all those who believe; for there is no distinction; 23 for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, 24 being justified as a gift by His grace through the redemption which is in **Christ Jesus**; 25 whom God displayed publicly as a **propitiation in His blood** through faith."

Jesus fulfilled the Law FOR us not through us.






False belief #5

Good works empowered by the Holy Spirit are necessary for reconciliation with God.

Romans 4

"4 Now to the one who works, his wage is not reckoned as a favor, but as what is due. 5 But to the one who does not work, but believes in Him who justifies the ungodly, his faith is reckoned as righteousness, 6 just as David also speaks of the blessing upon the man to whom God reckons righteousness apart from works: 7 "Blessed are those whose lawless deeds have been forgiven, And whose sins have been covered. 8 Blessed is the man whose sin the Lord will not take into account.""

The righteousness of faith is apart from our "good" works.

General observations on FAITH.

- **✓** Every human has faith in something.
- √ Saving faith starts with insight, which is the result of many factors.
- √ The real issue is the object and subject of our faith.
- √ Saving faith should be distinguished from the "walk of" faith.
- √ True faith always produces inner fruit (a changed heart and life direction) and normally (but not always) outer fruit (a life of love & truth).



False belief #6 The righteousness that saves comes from Christ's Spirit working through us.


Romans 10






A great change was preceded by a great exchange
