- Transcends culture, time, & age.
- Common characteristics.
 - Awareness of being dead
 - Emotional peace and being loved
 - Out-of-body experience
 - Tunnel of light

- Reluctance to return
- Life altering affects (usually positive).

22 Now it came about that the poor man died and he was carried away by the angels to Abraham's bosom; and the rich man also died and was buried. 23 And in Hades he lifted up his eyes, being in torment, and saw Abraham far away, and Lazarus in his bosom. 24 And he cried out and said, "Father Abraham, have mercy on me, and send Lazarus, that he may dip the tip of his finger in water and cool off my tongue; for I am in agony in this flame."

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Observations

Context

- Look ahead The unjust steward Lk.16:1-13
- Look back The regretful rich man Lk.16:19-31

Two rich men


- Rich man was materially rich In this life he prospered but in the next life he suffered.
- Lazarus found favor with God In this life he suffered but in the next life he was blessed.


Two issues

- Choices in this life bring consequences in the next.
- Ears to hear (not more evidence) is the issue.

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The four Biblical terms translated "hell"

- Sheol Hebrew (used 31 times) An expression meaning the general abode of the soul's of the dead. It is an obscure, shadowy place of futility
- Hades Greek (used 10 times) The N.T. equivalent of Sheol, "the lower parts of the earth" Eph.4:9
- Gehenna (used 10 times in the Gospels) The place of future eternal punishment of the wicked, the lake of fire (a burial pit outside Jerusalem).
- Tartarus (used only in 2 Pet.2:4) A prison for demons and Satan (abyss, bottomless pit).

Luke 16

"25 But Abraham said, "Child, remember that during your life you received your **good things**, and likewise Lazarus **bad things**; but now he is being **comforted** here, and you are in **agony**. 26 And besides all this, between us and you there is a great chasm fixed, in order that those who wish to come over from here to you may not be able, and that none may cross over from there to us."

- There is not a positive correlation between between a Godly heart and worldly success.
- Worldly success can be a hindrance to spiritual insight and blessing.

Revelation 3:17 "Because you say, "**I am rich, and have become wealthy**, and have need of nothing," and **you do not know** that you are wretched and miserable and poor and blind and naked,"

Luke 16

"27 And he said, "Then I beg you, Father, that you send him to my father's house — 28 for I have five brothers that he may warn them, lest they also come to this place of **torment**." 29 But Abraham said, "**They have Moses and the Prophets; let them hear them**." 30 But he said, "No, Father Abraham, but if someone goes to them from the dead, they will repent!" 31 But he said to him, "**If they do not listen to Moses and the Prophets, neither will they be persuaded if someone rises from the dead**."

> "Torment" suggests an experience of great insight resulting in agony, and remorse with no comfort or end.

> > • More evidence does not correct blindness, deafness, & hardness of heart.

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1. Remember to take your baptism seriously

- We are Alien Ambassadors to this world.
- Our goal is not to win in this world but rather to be "salt and light" in this world.
- It is better to do the right thing knowing that you may suffer for it.

"I am trying to follow Jesus and it is not working for me." What did you expect in following a man who was crucified.

• Realistic expectations are vital to personal joy and peace in this life.

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2. Request the right things.

• We don't need a personal NDE.




• Pray not for "perfect choices" but for wisdom and ability to grow through all circumstances.

Respond to the Light you have.

- Comprehensive Contingency



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
