


Is the Gospel a call to LOVE God and all those He loves?

Mark 12

"28 And one of the scribes came and heard them arguing, and recognizing that He had answered them well, asked Him, "What commandment is the foremost of all?" 29 Jesus answered, "The foremost is, 'Hear, O Israel! The Lord our God is one Lord; 30 and you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength.' 31 The second is this, 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no other commandment greater than these." 32 And the scribe said to Him, "Right, Teacher, You have truly stated that He is One; and there is no one else besides Him; 33 and to love *Him with all the heart and with all the understanding and* with all the strength, and to love one's neighbor as himself, is much more than all burnt offerings and sacrifices." 34 And when Jesus saw that he had answered intelligently, He said to him, "You are not far from the kingdom of God."


The Scripture speaks of the Kingdom of God as a "restoration".


Could this restoration be a recovery of what was lost in the sin of Adam?


Romans 5:17

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"29 But wishing to justify himself, he said to Jesus, "And who is my neighbor?""

The scribe reasoned:

- ✓ It is "easy" to love a god that I make in my own image or the image of my culture.
- ✓ It is "harder" to love a broken world and the broken people in it.
- ✓ If he is going to pass this test he must narrow the field of social responsibility.
- Those who live "under the Law" tend to appeal to technicalities to make the Law manageable.
- The parable is to answer the question What does it mean to love God and my neighbor?

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"30 Jesus replied and said, "A certain man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho; and he fell among robbers, and they stripped him and beat him, and went off leaving him half dead. 31 And by chance a certain **priest** was going down on that road, and when he saw him, he passed by on the other side. 32 And likewise a **Levite** also, when he came to the place and saw him, passed by on the other side."

• The Jerusalem Jews did not respect or see the Samaritan sect as orthodox and vice versa.

"33 But a certain **Samaritan**, who was on a journey, came upon him; and when he saw him, he **felt compassion**, 34 and **came to him**, and **bandaged up his wounds**, pouring oil and wine on them; and he **put him on his own beast**, and **brought him to an inn**, and **took care of him**. 35 And on the next day he took out two denarii and gave them to the innkeeper and said, 'Take care of him; and **whatever more you spend**, when I return, I will repay you.'

"36 Which of these three do you think proved to be a neighbor to the man who fell into the robbers' hands?" 37 And he said, "The one who showed mercy toward him." And Jesus said to him, **"Go and do the same."**


"28 And He said to him, "You have answered correctly; *do this, and you will live.*"

"20 If someone says, "I love God," and hates his brother, he is a liar; for **the one who does not love his brother whom he has seen, cannot love God whom he has not seen**. 21 And this commandment we have from Him, that the one who loves God should love his brother also"


Matthew 25

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
Our pain comes not so much from our being broken people in a broken world as it does from the sense of isolation that brokenness creates.


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Isolation is the essence of hell.

James 2




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The word "take care" is used of pastoral and family care in 1 Tim.3:5. 30 6. Build a testimony for others and the world.
