

3. AFFIRMED common ground - Build on what we share in common.

What we don't mean by common ground:

- Shared personal preferences that are too narrow (not common).
- Superficial goals or means are not a common ground.
 - Perhaps the best affirmation we can offer to another is to respect their soul's search for its deepest longings (reconciliation with God, self, others & life).


View all people with a sense of reverence.


Matthew 25:40

See God's image in others, when others may not.









Why do humans commit suicide and animals do not?

Questions we should ask ourselves and others

When we exalt ourselves we look like "modern day Pharisees".


When we lay aside our strength to sacrificially serve we become the "Body of Christ"

1 Corinthians 12

"18 But now God has placed the members, each one of them, in the body, just as He desired. 19 And if they were all one member, where would the body be? 20 But now there are many members, but one body. 21 And the eye cannot say to the hand, "I have no need of you"; or again the head to the feet, "I have no need of you." 22 On the contrary, it is much truer that the members of the body which seem to be weaker are necessary; 23 and those members of the body, which we deem less honorable, on these we bestow more abundant honor, and our unseemly members come to have more abundant seemliness, 24 whereas our seemly members have no need of it. But God has so composed the body, giving more abundant honor to that member which lacked, 25 that there should be no division in the body, but that the members should have the same care for one another. 26 And if one member suffers, all the members suffer with it; if one member is honored, all the members rejoice with it." 29
