



#### Luke 14

"25 Now great multitudes were going along with Him; and He turned and said to them, 26 If anyone comes to Me, and does not hate his own father and mother and wife and children and brothers and sisters, yes, and even his own life, he cannot be My disciple. 27 Whoever does not carry his own cross and come after Me cannot be My disciple."

## Jesus challenges us to make sacrificial choices.


"He who loves father or mother more than Me is not worthy of Me; and he who loves son or daughter more than Me is not worthy of Me."

"28 For which one of you, when he wants to build a tower, does not first sit down and calculate the cost, to see if he has enough to complete it? 29 Otherwise, when he has laid a foundation, and is not able to finish. all who observe it begin to ridicule him, 30 saying, "This man began to build and was not able to finish."

31 Or what king, when he sets out to meet another king in battle, will not first sit down and take counsel whether he is strong enough with ten thousand men to encounter the one coming against him with twenty thousand? 32 Or else, while the other is still far away, he sends a delegation and asks terms of peace."



Jesus challenges us to think critically & rationally.



"33 So therefore, no one of you can be My disciple who does not give up all his own possessions. 34 Therefore, salt is good; but **if even salt has become tasteless**, with what will it be seasoned? 35 It is useless either for the soil or for the manure pile; it is thrown out. He who has ears to hear, let him hear."




#### Ephesians 5

## **Marriage - a picture of discipleship?**


- Discipleship is seeing ourselves differently. Like marriage it is a covenant calling us to altar (and alter) our lives. We no longer act as though single but live in union with our mate.
- Baptism is a spiritual marriage ceremony.
   It is a formal INITIATION of a covenant relationships with responsibilities.
  - Discipleship is like marriage not perfect, nor easy, but involves serious and sacrificial life changes that count the cost and walk the walk out of love.

### Managing the stress in a broken world

- Face reality this is not heaven and it may will get worse before it gets better.
- We are not alone Christ's Spirit is a "Comforter", "Teacher" not a surrogate.
- We can handle it if we get ourselves out of the way.
  The Spirit anoints US not our circumstances.
- Be salt and light We can make a difference IN the lives of others by giving them hope not heaven.
- Consider the alternatives Where else can we go?
- Count the cost as we disattach from the idols we once thought would save us.
- No "get out of jail free" card miracles are SIGNS not solutions.

#### Philippians 4

# Application to social injustice and strife

- Don't be a part of the problem. by failing to be a disciple (Rom.12:1-2).

- If we are the minority or without power. witness to a hope and joy from sharing in Christ's suffering.




#### James 2




Note that it is the way we view ourselves in relation to each other that is the big concern.







