Who are "Jesus' sheep"?

The context must determine what "my sheep" means - the Jewish nation or the remnant of believers within it.



"He came to **His own**, and those who were His own did not receive Him"

How would the leaders of Israel receive this seeing that they were not following Jesus?

2. Man's choice of God (Elect THROUGH belief)

based on God's foreknowledge of human free choice Who are "My sheep" in John 10?

- 1. This is a major text supporting God's choice of man (elect TO believe).
- 2. It could refer to the believing remnant within Israel who recognize Jesus as the Christ.

We come to the Father through the Son, while in a sense the Jews of Jesus' time came to the Son through the Father and were then able to take part in the "Body of Christ" where only those joined to the Son can remain in right relationship with the Father.

Who are "My sheep" in John 10?

- 1. This is a major text supporting God's choice of man (elect TO believe).
- 2. It could refer to the believing remnant within Israel who recognize Jesus as the Christ.
- The election of individuals to salvation has been a hotly debated topic in Christian theology.
 - 1. God's people are going to read the texts on this issue in different ways.
 - 2. All Christian believe in election and predestination. The issue is based on what God's choice or man's.



TULIP (Reformed Theology)

- Total depravity we are incapable of responding to Christ without first being regenerated.
- U nconditional election God chose individuals for salvation based on His sovereign will alone.
- Limited atonement Christ's death effected the redemption of the elect only.
- I rresistible grace All whom God calls cannot but respond with faith and obedience.
- Preservation of the saints All whom God calls will not fail to display faith and good works until the end.



TULIP's roots (presuppositions)

- The reading of both O.T. and N.T. as though they are addressed TO and ABOUT us.
- God's sovereignty demands the micromanagement of all things based on His free choice alone.
- The belief that human free choice is a meritorious work.
- All of Scripture must be understood so as to conform to the above foundations.

Pruning TULIP (Arminian theology)

- Total depravity Effects every area of life but not completely.
- U nconditional election God elected Christ and all that He foresaw would freely respond to him.
- Limited atonement Christ's death paid the debt of all humanity but its benefits were realized only by those who received Christ by faith.
- rresistible grace We are free to receive or reject Christ.
- P erseverance of the saints Salvation is for those who maintain their faith and hope in Christ.

"Calvinism emphasizes divine sovereignty and free grace; Arminianism emphasizes human responsibility. The one restricts the saving grace to the elect; the other extends it to all men on the condition of faith. Both are right in what they assert; both are wrong in what they deny. . . . The Bible gives us a theology which is more human than Calvinism, and more divine than Arminianism, and more Christian than either of them."

Romans 8:28

The "all things" include

- 1. our free decisions,
- 2. world circumstances
- 3. His ultimate purpose

"His purpose" is

- 1. our calling in Christ,
- 2. conformed to his image
- 3. speaking truth in love

"12 So then, my beloved, just as you have always obeyed, not as in my presence only, but now much more in my absence, work out your salvation with fear and trembling; 13 for it is God who is at work in you, both to will and to work for His good pleasure."

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"My sheep"

- · They hear, recognize, & follow the voice of the Good Shepherd.
- The Good Shepherd will not let the predators get to the sheep. What does this mean?
 - ✓ It does not mean that they will never go astray. because many "saints" in the N.T. were not walking in the grace and truth of Christ.
 - Could it mean that those who go astray do so only by their own will and are never stolen from the fold?
 - √ This view seems to harmonize with the warnings given to the believing church to take responsibility to abide in the faith. 14

"My sheep"


- · They hear, recognize, & follow the voice of the Good Shepherd.
- The Good Shepherd will not let the predators get to the sheep. What does this mean?
 - √ The codependent pastor medicating his personal spiritual needs through the manipulation of the sheep to affirm him.
 - The controlling pastor managing his lack of faith by micromanaging the sheep and expelling those who do not cooperate.
 - ✓ NOTE: Rebellious sheep can be healthy if they are rebelling against thieves & robbers.

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A full explanation of God's choices and our choices lies above our spiritual pay-grade.
