## Romans

- a. Man has no righteousness apart from faith (1:18-3:20)
- b. Imputed Righteousness is of faith. (3:21-5:21)
  - 1. Faith righteousness is required by the nature of God and man (3:21-31)
  - 2. Faith righteousness is illustrated in Abraham. (4:1-25)
    - a. It was apart from his works. (4:1-8)

### **Illustration #1 Abraham** "faith was reckoned as righteousness"

"1 What then shall we say that Abraham, our forefather according to the flesh, has found? 2 For if Abraham was justified by works, he has something to boast about; but not before God. 3 For what does the Scripture say? "And Abraham believed God, and it was reckoned to him as righteousness."

### **Illustration #2 Wages** "justifies the ungodly"

4 Now to the one who works, his wage is not reckoned as a favor, but as what is due. 5 But to the one who does not work, but believes in Him who justifies the ungodly, his faith is reckoned as righteousness,

#### **Illustration #3 David** "sins don't count"

6 just as David also speaks of the blessing upon the man to whom God reckons righteousness apart from works: 7 " Blessed are those whose lawless deeds have been forgiven, And whose sins have been covered. 8 Blessed is the man whose sin the Lord will not take into account."

How are we to understand James 2:14-26 in light of Romans 4:1-8?

But someone may {well} say, "You have faith, and I have works; **show me** your faith without the works, and **I will show you** my faith by my works." 19 You believe that God is one. You do well; the demons also believe, and shudder. But are you willing to recognize, you foolish fellow, that faith without works **is useless?**

Was not Abraham our father justified by works, when he offered up Isaac his son on the altar? 22 You see that faith was working with his works, and as a result of the works, faith was perfected; 23 and the Scripture was fulfilled which says, "And Abraham believed God, and it was reckoned to him as righteousness," and he was called the friend of God. 24 You see that a man is justified by works, and not by faith alone. 25 And in the same way was not Rahab the harlot also justified by works, when she received the messengers and sent them out by another way? 26 For just as the body without {the} spirit is dead, so also faith without works is dead.
