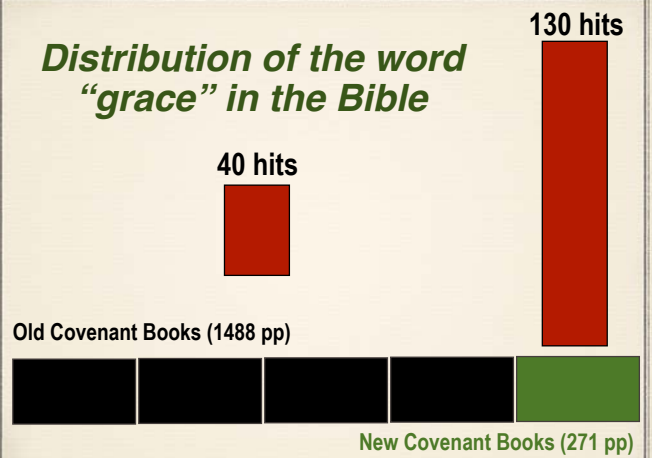


Differing *emphasis* between Jesus and Paul

Fulfillment of the promises to Israel	A mystery before it was revealed to Paul
Temporal renewal	Eternal salvation

Distribution of the word "grace" in the Bible



Paul's Gospel represents a new revelation.

Ephesians 3:3-5

"that by revelation there was made known to me the mystery, . . . which **in other generations was not made known to the sons of men**, as it has now been revealed to His holy apostles and prophets in the Spirit;"

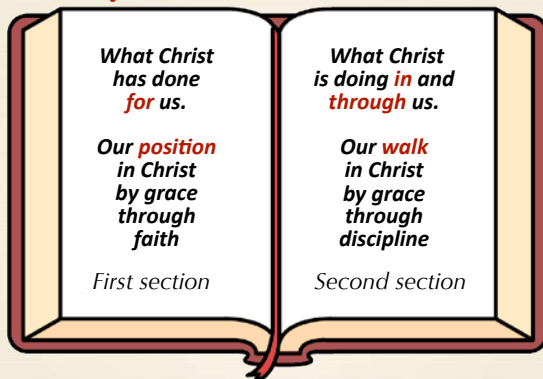
Acts - Epistles

Acts 11

"15 And as I began to speak, the Holy Spirit fell upon them just as He did upon us **at the beginning**.
16 And I remembered the word of the Lord, how He used to say, 'John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit.'"

The coming of the Spirit was not a continuation of what had been **but the beginning of something new.**

reminding us of the death and resurrection of Jesus

The relationship of Paul's Gospel to Jesus

Romans 1

"1 Paul, a bond-servant of Christ Jesus, called as an apostle, set apart for the gospel of God,"

Paul's message clarifies the significance of Jesus' cross and resurrection.

Don't let the ethical teaching & miracle working of Jesus displace his real purpose in coming.

The relationship of the Old Testament to the New Testament.


Romans 1

"2 which He promised beforehand through His prophets in the holy Scriptures,"

The New covenant is not an upgrade of the Old but a displacement of it.

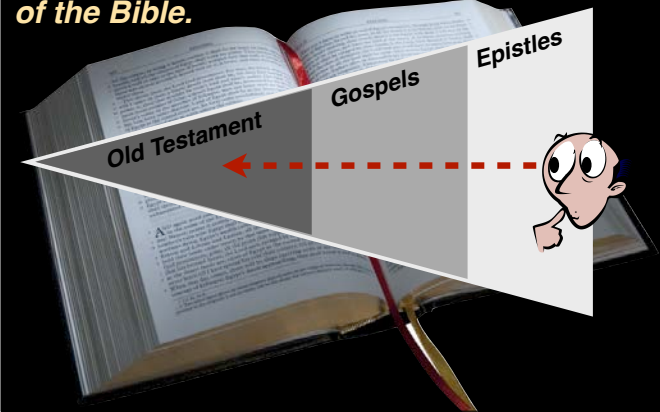
The O.T. is written for us but not about us or to us.

The Old Testament gives us a framework and context for the New Testament.



Old Testament Gospels Epistles

The Epistles explain the significance and meaning of the rest of the Bible.



Implications (Sabbath as an example)

- We don't balance the O.T. with the N.T.
- We don't harmonize the O.T. with the N.T.
- We don't apply the O.T. to us directly.
- We don't allegorize the O.T. to make it applicable to us.
- We let the N.T. explain the O.T.
- We see much of the N.T. (Christ) concealed (symbolized) in the O.T.

The relationship of Jesus' humanity and deity

Romans 1

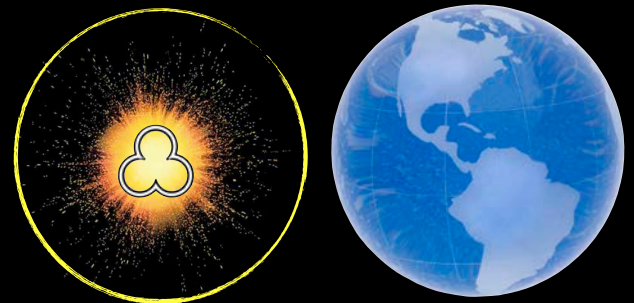
"3 concerning His Son, who was born of a descendant of David according to the flesh, 4 who was declared the Son of God with power by the resurrection from the dead, according to the Spirit of holiness, Jesus Christ our Lord,"

The Incarnation creates a synergism between the spiritual and the physical.

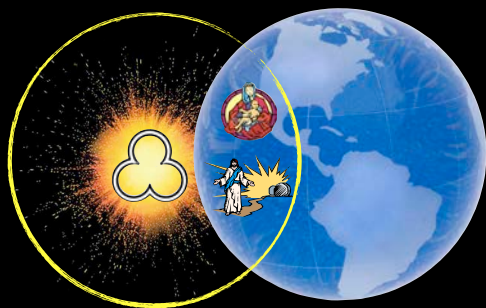
Reason (science) & faith should not be in conflict.

We have in Jesus a model of what it means to be fully human (bearing God's image).

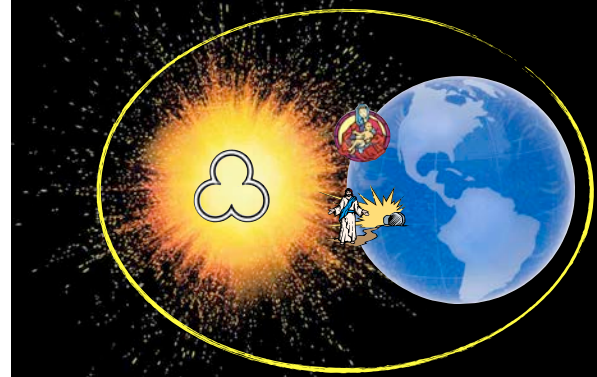
The material world and the *spiritual world* are different spheres of reality.



The material world and the *spiritual world* overlap in the Biblical story.



The material world is an extension of the *spiritual world*.



The relationship of faith and works

Romans 1

“5 through whom we have received grace and apostleship to bring about the obedience of faith among all the Gentiles, for His name’s sake, 6 among whom you also are the called of Jesus Christ; 7 to all who are beloved of God in Rome, called as saints: Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.”

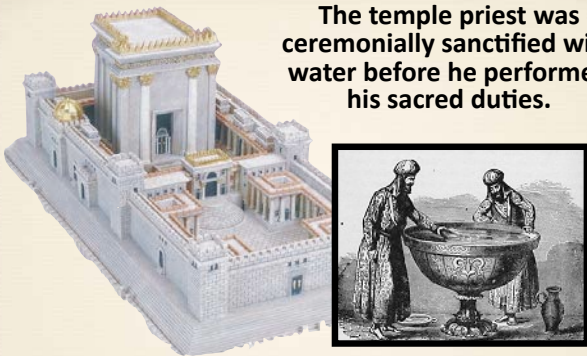
Faith is the obedience that saves, not the means to the obedience that saves.

**We are saved by grace
(apart from good works)
unto (so that we might live out)
good works.**

The two aspects of holiness



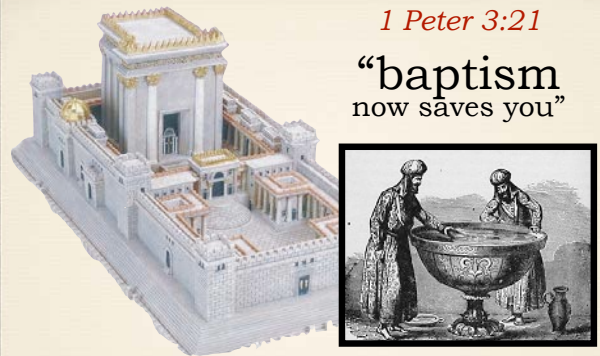
The temple priest was ceremonially sanctified with water before he performed his sacred duties.

This had to do with his official position not his personal character.

Four concerns

- We can displace Jesus’ cross and resurrection with his ethics and miracles.
- We can combine the old and new covenants and do justice to neither.
- We can separate the physical from the spiritual and disrespect both our humanity and science.
- We can confuse faith with works and forfeit inner peace.
