
# Authentic Christian experience is: Action (hands) behaviorally expressing Affection (heart) emotionally engaging Affirmation (head)



# The structure of Romans 1-8

1. The Christian Gospel - 1:1-17 "the righteous shall live by faith"

cognitively embracing

- 2. Step #1 Condemnation of all 1:18-3:20 "that every mouth may be closed and all the world may become accountable to God."
- 3. Step #2 Justification by faith 3:21-5:21 "faith is credited as righteousness."
- 4. Step #3 New life in Christ 6-8 "we have died to sin with Christ."

# Romans 3

"21 But now apart from the Law the righteousness of God has been manifested, being witnessed by the Law and the Prophets, 22 even the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all those who believe; for there is no distinction; 23 for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, 24 being justified as a gift by His grace through the redemption which is in Christ Jesus; 25 whom God displayed publicly as a propitiation in His blood through faith. This was to demonstrate His righteousness, because in the forbearance of God He passed over the sins previously committed;"

"26 for the demonstration, I say, of His righteousness at the present time, that He might be just and the justifier of the one who has faith in Jesus. 27 Where then is boasting? It is excluded. By what kind of law? Of works? No, but by a law of faith. 28 For we maintain that a man is justified by faith apart from works of the Law. 29 Or is God the God of Jews only? Is He not the God of Gentiles also? Yes, of Gentiles also, 30 since indeed God who will justify the circumcised by faith and the uncircumcised through faith is one. 31 Do we then nullify the Law through faith? May it never be! On the contrary, we establish the Law."

# What does Paul mean by the "righteousness of God?"

- Trustworthiness The right-ness or just-ness of God
   His faithfulness to his covenant promises.
- 2. Holiness The Godly character that is needed by all who would have fellowship with Him.
- "26 . . that He might be **just** and the **justifier** of the one who has faith in Jesus."

# Romans 3:31

"Do we then nullify the Law through faith? May it never be! On the contrary, we establish the Law."

- God does not lay aside one point of the Law's strict demand for holiness.
- The Law's demand for perfect obedience and atonement for sin is satisfied in the life and death of Jesus.
- In fulfilling the Law, Jesus brings it to an end as a covenant. It has served its purpose.
- We do not have to meet those demands because Jesus has.

Four kinds of righteousness (holiness)


· The righteousness of God


This is the perfect, holy, character of God.


- *The righteousness of faith*This is the imputed holiness of Christ.

- *The "righteousness" of the flesh*This is the superficial holiness of man.





















being **justified** as a gift by His grace through the **redemption** which is in Christ Jesus; 25 whom God displayed publicly as a **propitiation** in His blood through faith.

God's trustworthiness is seen in how the Gospel is centered in Christ (Messiah).

- 1. He came for the purpose of dying as a sacrifice for sin (the emphasis of the Epistles).
- 2. To satisfy the Law of Moses he redeemed or purchased our freedom from slavery to sin.
- 3. He satisfied the just wrath of a holy God against sin.
- 4. He took our sin and gave us his righteousness.


# "justified"

- to declare righteous as though a person had no sin.
- This is a legal declaration freeing a person from condemnation.
- This has nothing to do with human performance only with a our trust in Christ as our righteousness.

# "redemption"

- to buy one's freedom from bondage.
- to pay a price for that freedom.

"24 being justified as a gift by His grace . . ."

- "justified" a declaration of righteousness not a new power to justify oneself before the Law.
- "grace" a gift, not a tool to reform one's self.

# Romans 4:5

"But to the one who does not work, but believes in Him who justifies the ungodly, his faith is credited as righteousness,"

# John 6:29

"This is the work of God, that you believe in Him whom He has sent."

# Ephesians 2:8-10

"For by grace you have been saved through faith; and that not of yourselves, it is a gift of God; not as a result of works, that no one should boast." "22 even the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all those who believe; for there is no distinction; 23 for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God,"

God's trustworthiness is seen in how the Gospel is tied to the Messiah.

- 1. The link to the righteousness that saves is Christ & faith not the Law & works.
- 2. The good news is not the power to reform the flesh but the imputed virtue of Christ through faith.

But what constitutes saving faith?

"27 Where then is boasting? It is excluded. By what kind of law? Of works? No, but by a law of faith. 28 For we maintain that a man is justified by faith apart from works of the Law."

- · Faith is not a work according to Paul.
- Faith takes away any pride that man might have in his relationship with God.

- God did not settle accounts with respect to sin until Christ was crucified.
- But now God satisfies the full demand of the Law (in the life and sacrifice of Christ) thus showing Himself to be just.
- God justifies by faith all who fulfilled the demands of the Law "in Christ."

### Lessons

- God takes the initiative and fulfills the Law's call for holiness.
- Our responsibility is not to do the works of the Law but to believe.
- The Gospel is not the power to reform but the gift of the righteousness of Christ.
- The Gospel is first of all received by faith not feeling or action.
