as a guilty sinner for the redemption of His people.


^{1.} He exposes Himself

The living God opens Himself to the empirical world of space, matter, and time and appeals to our rational senses.




"For since the creation of the world His invisible attributes, His eternal power and divine nature, have been clearly seen, being understood through what has been made, so that they are without excuse."

When Christianity retreats from this world and reason, it gives up too much. The Verification of Christianity




