



Empathy

1. It is the foundation of all human ethics.

It is the essence of the Golden Rule



The Golden Rule



3. Empathy takes the initiative to lay “self” aside. vs.7


4. Empathy is willing to suffer loss for what is love. vs.8







Three critical questions

- 1. Can you remember the last time someone listened to you with empathetic understanding?*
- 2. Can you FORGET that experience?*
- 3. What have you learned from it?*

How is empathy developed?

- 1. It is learned as it is **modeled** for us by others (especially early in life).*
- 2. It is cultivated through **listening**.*
- 3. It is acquired as we **audit** our own souls.*
- 4. It is an AP that comes with the installment of **Christ's Spirit**.*
