

# Two overlooked challenges to reading the Bible


- 1. Poor methods
- 2. Little patience



# The Point of this lesson

Reading the Bible can be likened to mining for gold.

- 1. Starting with a goal in mind
- 2. Mining the text for ore
- 3. Refining the ore for gold
- 4. Turning gold to jewelry
- 5. Wearing it

# 1. Start with the right goal in mind.

#### Some inadequate goals:

- · Settling for historical, academic facts.
- · Seeking a feel good spiritual experience.
- Looking for verses that seem to support our view.

#### Some much better goals:

- To develop wisdom from holy Scripture.
- To learn the way of the Holy Spirit.



## 2. Mine the ore (Get the facts)

· Make a mechanical layout of the text.

#### Genesis 12

1 Now the Lord said to Abram, "Go forth

from your country,
And from your relatives
And from your father's house,
To the land
which I will show you:

2 And I will make you

a great nation,
And I will bless you,
And make your name great;
And so you shall be a blessing;

And I will bless those

who bless you,
And the one who curses you
I will curse.


And in you

# 2. Mine the ore (Get the facts)

- Make a mechanical layout of the text.
- Learn where and how to dig:
  - Things that are emphasized.
  - Things that are repeated.
  - Things that are related.
  - Things that are alike and unlike.
  - Things that are true to life.
- Bombard the text with questions from heart, mind, and observations of life.
- Prayerfully Meditate on the text over time.






# 3. Refine the gold (see the relevance).

- If this text is an answer, what is the question?
- · Commit to an investigation that will be hard work.
- Be persistent, patient, and prayerful. Don't quit until you find its spiritual treasures.
- Seek out solid help (teachers, books, classes, etc.) that guide your study of the Scripture.
- Prayerfully Meditate on the text over time.
- Make a chart to see key relationships and literary context.

#### Context:

- "theological, literary, cultural, personal"
   Distinguish:
- "modern English" from "ancient languages"
- "literal" from "literary"
- "occasional" from "principle"
- "descriptive" from "prescriptive"
- · "cultural" from "universal"
- "prophecy" from "fulfillment"
- "Inerrancy" from "precision"

## Four views of Biblical inerrancy

#### Isaiah 65:1

"I was **ready to be sought by** those who did not ask for me."

#### Romans10:20

"I have **shown myself to** those who did not ask for me."

Paul quotes from the Greek translation, which digresses from the Hebrew text.

#### Matthew 19:8

"He said to them, 'Because of your hardness of heart, **Moses permitted** you to divorce your wives; but from the beginning it has not been this way."

Divorce was not God's will but it was prescribed in Deut.24:1-4 as the lesser of two evils.

#### 2 Samuel 5:13

"After he left Hebron, **David took more concubines** and wives in Jerusalem, and more sons and daughters were born to him."

This description of what was permitted was not a prescription of what should happen.

#### Matthew 19:8

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Divorce was not God's will but it was prescribed in Deut.24:1-4 as the lesser of two evils.

#### 1 Corinthians 8:4

"Therefore concerning the **eating of things** sacrificed to idols, we know that there is no such thing as an idol in the world, and that there is no God but one."

"Things sacrificed to idols" is a cultural issue illustrating a universal principle.

#### Acts 2:4

"And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak with other tongues, as the Spirit was giving them utterance."

This description of what happened is not necessarily a prescription of what should always happen.

#### Galatians 3:16

"Now the promises were spoken to Abraham and to his seed. He does not say, "And to seeds," as referring to many, but rather to one, "And to your seed," that is, Christ."

Paul is not sighting any O.T. text as a "proof text" he is interpreting the O.T.. (See also Isa.53 "suffering servant" as Jesus)

#### Leviticus 18:5

"So you shall keep My statutes and My judgments, by which a man may live if he does them; I am the Lord."

This promise of life (salvation) "by works" is cited by Paul in Gal.3:12 as standing in contrast to "by faith", which is of a Gospel revealed in a latter theological period.

#### Following laws of the Spirit involves:

#### 1. Responding to what we already know

#### Hebrews 5

"11 Concerning him we have much to say, and it is hard to explain, since **you have become dull of hearing**. 12 For though **by this time you ought to be teachers**, you have need again for someone to teach you the elementary principles of the oracles of God, and you have come to need milk and not solid food. 13 For everyone who partakes only of milk is not accustomed to the word of righteousness, for he is a babe. 14 But solid food is for the mature, who because of practice have their senses trained to discern good and evil."

(See also Rom.1:21-23, Amos 8:11-12 in context)

#### 1 Corinthians 1

"15 But he who is spiritual appraises all things, yet he himself is appraised by no man. 16 For who has known the mind of the Lord, that he should instruct Him? But we have the mind of Christ.""

#### John 16:14

"He (Holy Spirit) shall glorify Me; for He shall take of Mine, and shall disclose it to you."

1 Corinthians 11:1

"Be imitators of me, just as I also am of Christ." (context = selfless service)

"Now these things, brethren, I have figuratively applied to myself and Apollos for your sakes, that in us you might learn not to exceed what is written, in order that no one of you might become arrogant in behalf of one against the other."
