


How to read the Old Testament




The point of Genesis 1-2 It challenges the worldview claims of its time by revealing that -


- The Creator, God is over nature (creation) in contrast to origins via clash of cosmic forces (Babylonian) or self-generation (Egyptian).
- Creation is intrinsically good in contrast to Ugaritic myths of nature (sea) as a cosmic enemy.
- God does not battle against the cosmos in contrast to Ugaritic myths of nature (sea) as a cosmic enemy.
- Nature is the temple of God in contrast to being the essence of, or conquered foe of God.
- Man is to have dominion as an ambassador /steward of creation rather than worship it or abuse it.

Observations on the Biblical creation accounts

- 1. We cannot be too **dogmatic** as to what kind of narrative we have in Gen. 1-2.
- 2. The Scripture acknowledges both primary & secondary means in creation.
- 3. Biblical revelation seems to be concerned with more important issues than physical cosmology.
- 4. Most scientific theories are best critiqued by science not Scripture.

The purpose of Gen. 1 & 2 was theological and apologetical not scientific or historical.

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Genesis 2

" $_{\rm 15}$ Then the Lord God took the man and put him into the garden of Eden to **cultivate** it and **keep** it."

1. Adam's stewardship of the creation.

"18 Then the Lord God said, "It is not good for the man to be **alone**; I will make him a **helper suitable** for him.

2. Adam's social relationship with Eve.

"¹⁶ The Lord God commanded the man, saying, "From any tree of the garden you may eat freely; ¹⁷ but from **the tree of the knowledge of good and evil you shall not eat**, for in the day that you eat from it you will surely **die**."

3. Adam's spiritual link with the Creator.

1. Human stewardship of the planet - cover, control, conserve, and consume.

Genesis 1

"27 God created man in His own image, in the image of God He created him; male and female He created them. 28 God blessed them; and God said to them, "**Be fruitful and multiply, and fill the earth, and subdue it; and rule over** the fish of the sea and over the birds of the sky and over every living thing that moves on the earth." 29 Then God said, "Behold, **I have given you every** plant yielding seed that is on the surface of all the earth, . . . 31 God saw all that He had made, and behold, it was very good. And there was evening and there was morning, the sixth day."

How are we to discern what is "occasional" and what is "for us today" ?





2. Human gender roles and rights intimacy, equality, complementary.

"18 Then the Lord God said, "It is not good for the man to be alone; I will make him a helper suitable for him. . . . 21 So the Lord God caused a deep sleep to fall upon the man, and he slept; then He took one of his ribs and closed up the flesh at that place. 22 The Lord God fashioned into a woman the rib which He had taken from the man, and brought her to the man. 23 The man said, "This is now bone of my bones, And flesh of my flesh; She shall be called Woman, Because she was taken out of Man." 24 For this reason a man shall leave his father and his mother, and be joined to his wife; and they shall become one flesh. 25 And the man and his wife were both naked and were not ashamed."

1 Timothy 2




Ephesians 5




1 Peter 3:1


"In the same way, you wives, **be submissive to your own husbands** so that even if any of them are disobedient to the word, they may be won without a word by the behavior of their wives."











Galatians 3




The context of this passage is "spiritual family identity" not "ministry roles."


A parallel passage teaches gender roles -Col. 3:11 "a renewal in which there is no distinction between Jew and Greek . . . ",


vs.18 "Wives be subject to your husbands."
