

### What did he mean by repent?

#### 1. Repentance has to do with change in the way we see things.


#### Matthew 6:22

"The lamp of the body is the eye; if therefore your eye is clear, your whole body will be full of light."

#### Three common **MISPERCEPTIONS**:

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- 1. Strong feelings = Repentance
- 2. Changed behavior = Repentance
- 3. Social relocation = Repentance



#### Acts 26:18

"to **open their eyes** so that they may **turn from darkness to light and from the dominion of Satan to God**, in order that they may receive forgiveness of sins and an inheritance among those who have been sanctified by faith in Me"

Repentance that saves is a "domain" change **based on insight** that leads to faith and good works.




#### 2 Timothy 2:26

"and they may **come to their senses and escape from the snare of the devil**, having been held captive by him to do his will."

#### Romans 12

"1 I urge you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, (**insight**) to present your bodies a living and holy sacrifice, acceptable to God, which is your spiritual service of worship. 2 And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind (**perception**), that you may prove what the will of God is, that which is good and acceptable and perfect. "

## 2. Penitent faith is our step into the Kingdom of God.



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## Repentance in the O.C. is distinct from that in the N.C.

#### Ezekiel 18

"21 But if the wicked man **turns from all his sins** which he has committed and observes all My statutes and practices justice and righteousness, **he shall surely live**; he shall not die. 22 All his transgressions which he has committed will not be remembered against him; **because of his righteousness which he has practiced**, he will live."

Works righteousness is the O.C. emphasis. even though "faith righteousness" is mentioned, but only in Gen.15:6.

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#### Mark1

"14 And after John had been taken into custody, Jesus came into Galilee, prea hing the gospel of God, 15 and saying, "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at and; **repent and believe in the gospel**.""

He expected his listeners to believe this turn away (repent) from worldly hopes and see in Christ the fulfillment of Israel's promises.


The N.C. viewed God's kingdom as spiritual / eternal and was accessed by turning from hope in works righteousness to faith righteousness.

#### Hebrews 6:1


"let us press on to maturity, not laying again a foundation of repentance from **dead works and of** faith toward God,"

#### Hebrews 9:14

"14 how much more will the blood of Christ, who through the eternal Spirit offered Himself without blemish to God, **cleanse your conscience from dead works** to serve the living God? 15 And for this reason He is the mediator of a new covenant,"



# Mixing the covenants has led to confusion concerning the Christian Gospel.



## Hebrews 6

"1 Therefore leaving the elementary teaching about the Christ, let us press on to maturity, not laying again a **foundation of repentance from dead works and of faith toward God**, 2 of instruction about washings, and laying or of hands, and the resurrection of the dead, and eternal judgment. 3 And this we shall do, if God permits. 4 For in the case of those who have once been enlightened and have tasted of the heavenly gift and have been made partakers of the Holy Spirit 5 and have tasted the good word of God and the powers of the age to come, 6 and then have fallen awy, it is **impossible to renew them again to repentance**, since they again crucify to themselves the Son of God, and put Him to open shame."

#### Hebrews 10

"26 For if we go on sinning willfully after receiving the knowledge of the truth, **there no longer remains a sacrifice for sins**,

#### For those who reject the Cross of Christ the O.C. is no longer a shelter from God's wrath. *Hebrews 3:12-19, 10:14-18*

"14 For by one offering He has perfected for all time those who are sanctified. 15 And the Holy Spirit also bears witness to us; for after saying, 16 "This is the covenant that I will make with them After those days, says the Lord: I will put My laws upon their heart, And upon their mind I will write them," He then says,17 "And their sins and their lawless deeds I will remember no more." 18 Now where there is forgiveness of these things, there is no longer any offering for sin."

#### 3. Repentance is an opportunity and human responsibility.

#### Acts 11

"17 If God therefore gave to them the same gift as He gave to us also after believing in the Lord Jesus Christ, who was I that I could stand in God's way? 18 And when they heard this, they quieted down, and glorified God, saying, "Well then, **God has granted to the Gentiles also the repentance that leads to life**.""

> "Gentiles also" – All outside the covenant community of Israel were without the opportunity (not ability) to repent until they became Jews?

"The Gospel" (not repentance) may be God's gift.

#### 2 Timothy 2:24-26

"<sup>24</sup> And the Lord's bond-servant must not be quarrelsome, but be kind to all, able to **teach**, patient when wronged, <sup>25</sup> with gentleness **correcting** those who are in opposition, if perhaps **God may grant them repentance leading to the knowledge of the truth**, <sup>26</sup> and they may come to their senses and escape from the snare of the devil, having been held captive by him to do his will."

# Is God's gift the ability to repent or opportunity (through correction) to repent?



"Corrective teaching" (not repentance) may be God's gift.

### Is repentant faith a gift from God to some and not others?

*Ephesians 2:8* "For by grace you have been saved through faith; and that not of yourselves, it is the gift of od;"

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John Calvin (**unlike many of his followers**) did not use this text to support his view that faith was a gift from God (Acts18:27, Phil.1:29).

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#### Is repentant faith a gift to the elect only? Summary Ephesians 2:8 "For by grace you have been saved through faith; and that not of ourselves, it is the gift of God;" 1. Repentance has to do with change in the way we see things.
