- The Hope is clarified & certain (The Resurrection)
- The Spirit is given (Pentecost)

How does **Pentecost** affect the way we read the O.T.?

- 1. Edifying self Position "in Christ". Fit for heaven as joint heirs with Christ to the kingdom of God.
 - ✓ Intimacy Moved from being slaves to adopted sons and daughters.
 - ✓ Enlightening Uncovering true meaning of the O.T. as it relates to God's ultimate plan through Christ.
 - ✓ Guiding A new heart, freedom from the Law, and a heavenly hope charts the believer's path.
- 2. Edifying others Christ in us. Fit for earth being equipped for ministry.
 - ✓ Evangelism Spreading the Gospel to the world.
 - Gifting Various motivations, ministries, and manifestations of the Spirit to build the Body of Christ.



Inconvenient Truths

- ✓ Many true believers do not experience the kind of life change they expect at conversion.
- ✓ Some experience a dramatic change through a "pentecostal" experience after conversion.

Not every believer shares this experience, leading to confused expectations.



• The Apostles' teaching (in the Epistles) assume that every Christian is baptized in the Holy Spirit.

1 Corinthians 12

"13 For by one Spirit **we were all baptized into one body**, whether Jews or Greeks, whether slaves or free, and we were all made to drink of one Spirit."

- The Apostles do not exhort "born again" believers to seek a second or special "baptism" or "filling" with / in / by the Spirit for power to minister.
- The Apostles recognize stages and classes of spiritual development but not of two comings of the Holy Spirit.

1 Corinthians 12

"1 Now concerning **spiritual** {**matters**,} brethren, I do not want you to be unaware. . . . 4 Now there are **varieties** of gifts, but the same Spirit. 5 And there are **varieties** of ministries, and the same Lord. 6 And there are **varieties** of effects, but the same God who works all things in all persons.

• We are to expect great variety in the way the Spirit is experienced and expressed.

"7 But to **each one** is given the **manifestation** of the Spirit for the **common good**."

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• The Spirit was given to every believer for the edification to the whole church.

Some believe that there are two visitations of the Spirit - one before and one at Pentecost

based on the following assumptions:

 Mixing O.C. with N.C. - All believers (including O.T. saints) were "born again" by the indwelling of the Spirit upon justifying faith (before Pentecost).

> Personal experience - Many Christians have a dramatic experience of the Spirit subsequent to "new birth". This two stage spiritual experience fits the narrative of Acts.

> > John 20:22 refers to the "indwelling" while Acts 2 refers to the "baptism / filling" of the Spirit.

John 20

"21 Jesus therefore said to them again, "Peace be with you; as the Father has sent Me, I also send you.22 And when He had said this, **He breathed** {**on them**}, **and said to them**, **"Receive the Holy Spirit.** 23 If you forgive the sins of any, their sins have been forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they have been retained."

Two different understandings

This is the indwelling and sealing that marks all believers as Christians.


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


This is the indwelling and sealing that marks all believers as Christians.











Luke 24

"47 and that repentance for forgiveness of sins should be proclaimed in His name to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem. 48 You are witnesses of these things. 49 And behold, I am sending forth the promise of My Father upon you; but you are to stay in the city until you are clothed with power from on high.""

Both proclaiming the Gospel and authority to define the boundaries of the Gospel go together.

A clarifying text Acts 11

"15 And as I began to speak, the Holy Spirit fell upon them (Acts 10:44-46), just as He did upon us at the beginning. 16 And I remembered the word of the Lord, how He used to say, 'John baptized with water, but you shall be baptized with the Holy Spirit.' 17 If God therefore gave to them the same gift as He gave to us also after believing in the Lord Jesus Christ, who was I that I could stand in God's way?" 18 And when they heard this, they quieted down, and glorified God, saying, "Well then, God has granted to the Gentiles also the repentance that leads to life.""

Romans 8:9

✓ The Apostles coach life change by calling for
- mind renewal and commitment
(not a second infilling of the Spirit).

Ephesians 3

"14 For this reason, I bow my knees before the Father, 15 from whom every family in heaven and on earth derives its name, 16 that He would grant you, according to the riches of His glory, **to be strengthened with power through His Spirit in the inner man**; 17 so that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith; and that you, being rooted and grounded in love, 18 may **be able to comprehend** with all the saints what is the breadth and length and height and depth, 19 and **to know the love of Christ** which surpasses knowledge, that you may be filled up to all the fullness of God."

- The Spirit's first and most important ministry is to challenge our perceptions of ourselves and the Body of Christ.
- Paul's prayer for the saints is that their perceptions would come in line with God's.

"Charismatic experience" may be "A" means to it.

Why do many believe that the Spirit did not come until Pentecost?

- Jesus had to go to the Father first. Jn.7:39, 14:26, 16:7, Acts 1:4, 2:33
- ✓ The disciples were to wait for the Spirit before they went to the world with the Gospel. Acts 1:4, 2:33
- ✓ The disciples did not seem to understand the significance of the Cross and Resurrection until after Pentecost. Acts 1:4, 2:33
- ✓ John 20:21-23 is best understood as a prophetic word.
- The N.T. writers do not speak of two comings of the Spirit.
- ✓ The N.T. Epistles assume all believers have the Spirit. There is no teaching of two comings. 1 Cor.12:13

Making sense of it all

- ✓ All spiritual experiences must be interpreted by some tradition or teaching.
- ✓ Pentecost was the beginning of New Covenant life. Acts 11:15
- ✓ All true believers are baptized in (indwelt by) the Spirit. 1 Cor.12:13
- ✓ The variety of manifestations of the Spirit should be respected as God's plan. 1 Cor.12:4-6
- ✓ If the only sign following your faith is love, don't feel cheated. Jn.13:35
- ✓ If you have had special spiritual experiences, use them to build the whole body.
- Know yourself, accept yourself, get over yourself, and give yourself.
