


- ✓ Some things will not change at all my past, circumstances, personality, etc.

- ✓ Some things will change over time character, sinful habits, choices, strengths, weaknesses.










Common holiness assumptions

- 1. Holiness has to do with intent.
- 2. Holiness has to do only with some areas of life.
- 3. Holiness comes only after a special experience with the Holy Spirit.
- 4. Holiness means we never continue in sinful behavior.

Common missteps to practiced holiness

- 1. Neglecting the need for godly living.
- 2. Confusing positional holiness with practiced holiness.
- 3. Making holiness manageable by lowering the bar.
- 4. Comparing self with others rather than Christ.
- 5. Mixing spiritual holiness with cultural morays.
- 6. Expecting a short cut to godliness.

Observations on the formation of practiced holiness

- 1. True Holiness is hard to measure.
- 2. Holy people tend to not focus on a) holiness, b) rules, or c) comparisons with others.
- 3. True Holiness starts with a renewed mind.
- 4. Spiritual growth shares common characteristics with physical, social, emotional growth.
- **5. Factors in spiritual maturation.** Modeling, Pain, Environment, Temperaments, Spiritual Disciplines, Prayer, Dramatic Experiences, Knowledge of Scripture.
- 6. Spiritual growth in holiness is parallel to growth in spiritual / emotional maturity.
