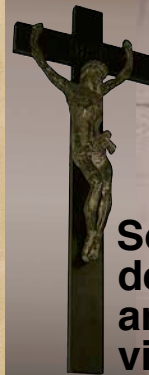
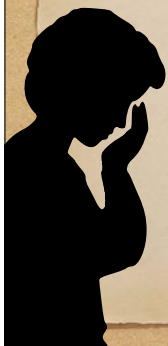

## The Parable of Prodigal Son

*Luke 15:11-32*

1. The younger son demands independence and leaves home.
2. He becomes destitute through worldly living.
3. This brings him to repent and return home.
4. His father graciously receives him back.
5. His older brother becomes bitter, feeling the father is not fair in graciously receiving the wayward younger brother.

### The Prodigal

Outwardly rebellious  
Saw himself as a humble, needy person  
In the end enjoyed the fellowship of the Father

### The Older Brother

Outwardly obedient  
Saw himself as a proud, entitled person  
Excluded himself from fellowship  
The portrait of a religious spirit

## The occasion for repentance

*Luke 15*

"<sup>11</sup> And He said, "A certain man had two sons; <sup>12</sup> and the younger of them said to his father, 'Father, give me the share of the estate that falls to me.' And he divided his wealth between them. <sup>13</sup> And not many days later, **the younger son gathered everything together and went on a journey into a distant country, and there he squandered his estate with loose living.**"

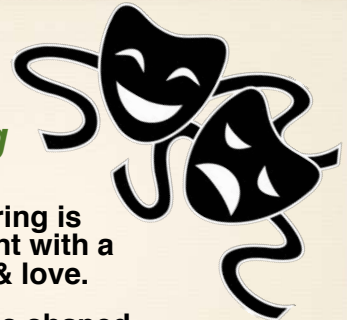

## Turning mourning into dancing



1. Pain and suffering is not inconsistent with a God of power & love.
2. Our character is shaped and showcased in our response to life's highs and lows.



## *Some of the many Purposes of Pain*

1. It reveals the depth of our neediness.
2. It gives meaning for our Gospel.
3. It builds depth in our character.
4. It brings empathy to our ministry.
5. It provides credibility to our witness.
6. It draws us nearer to our Lord.

## *Pain Etiquette*

1. Do not be intimidated by pain for yourself, family, or friends lest you miss its hidden value. God uses, even the afflictions of Satan - **2 Cor.12**
2. Be careful in the use of pain killers lest you miss God's purposes.
3. Comforting those in pain should come with words of wisdom (not just empathy and sympathy).
4. God's discipline (inflicting pain) is meant to help us "get it" when we don't.

## *Repentance (change of view & direction) may be called for if:*

1. I am suffering the **natural** effects of living in a fallen world and feeling hopeless.
2. I face the brunt of the sins of **others** and am bitter.
3. I have declared my **independence** from God to pursue a worldly life and am empty & ashamed.
4. I am **carrying** the suffering of others and exhausted.

**God's blessings are missed when we resist discipline, pass the blame, & kill the pain, in our life story.**
